The Kaho`olawe Island Reserve Commission's Hui Kapehe Project is designed to offer work experience, foundational training, community service learning, and job shadowing for Native Hawaiian students in industry-related fields.

In addition to their academic and career and technical education goals, students will improve their knowledge in the areas of Hawaiian studies and sustainability. Coursework will provide students with industry-standard experience that will boost their marketability and employability in their industry-related fields.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

- To enroll 60 students in Hui Kapehe CTE programs including administration, operations, restoration, culture, and ocean resource management.
- To assist 100% of enrolled students in completing their internships
- To assist a minimum of 83% of enrolled students in obtaining certification and continue on to higher education or employment.
