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**PROJECT SUMMARY:**

Leeward Community College's – Ho`oulu Project provides academic advising, support services, and career development activities to Native Hawaiian students in Science, Technology, Engineering, Math (STEM), Teaching, and Career and Technical Education (CTE) disciplines. Student engagement activities include: cultural speakers, malama `aina activities, Hawaiian language and arts enrichment, students mentoring and assessment, and career-planning workshops.

**PROJECT OBJECTIVES:**

- To serve 70 new and continuing Native Hawaiian students each year.
- Through the aid of tutoring and mentoring, to help 80% of students to pass their general education and 85% of students to pass their vocational education classes with grades of C or better.
- To encourage and support ten students each year to complete a service-learning, work experience, co-op, or internship successfully.
- To assist a minimum of ten students each year in obtaining industry certification, a college certificate, or a college degree.
- To encourage and assist a minimum of ten students in furthering their education, enlisting in the military services, obtaining employment, or gaining promotion in their current position.
