**SUBJECT:** Estimated Fiscal Year (FY) 2011 State Allocations under the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act of 2006 (Perkins IV)

I am pleased to provide you with estimated State allocations for FY 2011 under Title I (Career and Technical Education Assistance to the States) of the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act of 2006 (Perkins IV or the Act). Pursuant to the Full-Year Continuing Appropriation Act, 2011, the first portion of Title I funds becomes available for obligation by the Secretary on July 1, 2011. Under the Education Department General Administrative Regulations (EDGAR) at 34 CFR §76.703(d), July 1 is the earliest date that your State can obligate these funds. Under the Continuing Resolution, Title II (Tech Prep Education) of Perkins IV will not receive funding.

**Title I of Perkins IV**

Funds become available to your State at two separate times. Your first installment of Title I funds (approximately 30 percent) will become available on July 1, 2011. The remainder of your Title I funds will become available on October 1, 2011. Your State must obligate all funds by September 30, 2013 (end of the funding period). In addition, under EDGAR at 34 CFR §80.23(b), you must liquidate obligations within 90 days of the end of the funding period unless an extension is approved by this office.

Table 1 provides estimated Title I allocations for each State and outlying area, including the split of funds between July 1 and October 1. Please note the following with regard to the estimated allocations:

- Perkins IV requires that States distribute secondary funds under section 131(a)(2) of the Act based on the Bureau of the Census' estimate of the number of individuals aged 5 through 17, inclusive, who reside in the school district served by such local education agency and are from families below the poverty level for the preceding fiscal year, as determined by the most recent satisfactory data used under section 1124(c)(1)(A) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) of 1965, compared to the total number of individuals who reside in the school districts served by all the local educational

agencies in the State for such preceding fiscal year. ***This computation must be based on the most updated income and poverty estimates, reflecting “income year 2009” data based on 2009-2010 school district boundaries, which may be obtained at: <http://www.census.gov/did/www/saipe/district.html>***

- Perkins IV also requires that States distribute secondary funds under section 131(a)(1) of the Act based on the number of individuals aged 5 through 17, inclusive, who reside in the school district served by such local education agency for the preceding year compared to the total number of such individuals who reside in the school districts served by all local educational agencies in the State for such preceding fiscal year. ***This computation must be based on either—***
  - ***The most updated income and poverty estimates, reflecting “income year 2009” data based on 2009-2010 school district boundaries, which may be obtained at: <http://www.census.gov/did/www/saipe/district.html>;***
  - or*
  - ***The most updated student enrollment data, reflecting the 2008-2009 school year, collected by the National Center for Education Statistics through the Common Core of Data (CCD) survey system, which may be obtained at: [www.nces.ed.gov/ccd/pubagency.asp](http://www.nces.ed.gov/ccd/pubagency.asp).***

## **Title II of Perkins IV**

States will not receive new Title II grants under Perkins IV for the program year beginning on July 1, 2011. However, unobligated funds from Title II grants that became available on July 1, 2009, and July 1, 2010, remain available for obligation until September 30, 2011, and September 30, 2012, respectively, for allowable costs under Title II of Perkins IV and the State’s approved Perkins State plan.

A State may elect to consolidate any unobligated Title II funds from these two grants into Title I of Perkins IV. A State that decides to consolidate its remaining Title II funds must revise its State plan to reflect this consolidation. See section 202 of Perkins IV. ***Please note, however, consolidation of Title II funds will not extend the period of availability of these funds.***

## **Revised Budget and State Plan Submission Requirements**

Each eligible agency must resubmit for FY 2011:

- A revised budget to reflect its estimated Title I allocation in Table 1 for program year five, beginning on July 1, 2011, and indicate that it will not have an allocation for Title II for this program year. Please remember to enter the number **zero** for Title II amounts;
- If applicable, each eligible agency must revise its State plan to indicate the consolidation of any remaining Title II funds with Title I for FY 2011;
- Any other State plan revisions; and
- A cover letter that transmits these items and that is signed by someone who is authorized to act on behalf of the eligible agency.

## **Submission Deadline, Signature, and Address**

Each eligible agency must make its resubmission as soon as possible but no later than close of business on Friday, June 3, 2011. Resubmission should be made to the Perkins State Plan Web Site.
