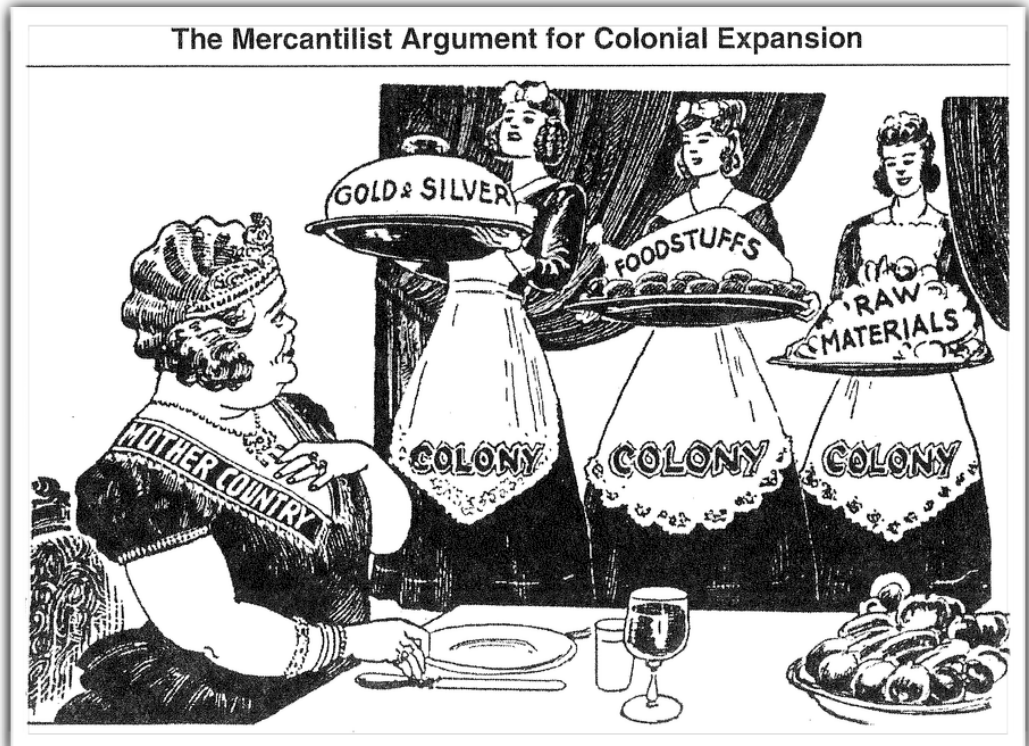


MERCANTILISM POLITICAL CARTOON ANALYSIS

Europe's American colonies existed mainly for the benefit of their home countries—Spain, Portugal, France and England. This idea was based on the theory of **mercantilism**. Under mercantilism, a nation could become rich and powerful in two ways: (1) by obtaining bullion - gold and silver, and (2) by establishing a favorable *balance of trade* in which it sold (export) more goods than it bought (imports).

In order to achieve a favorable balance of trade, nations established colonies. Colonies supplied *raw materials*, such as lumber, furs, cotton, grain, and tobacco to the home country. This way the home country did not have to purchase these goods from other nations. With the colonies, nations had a built-in market in which to sell the goods it produced.

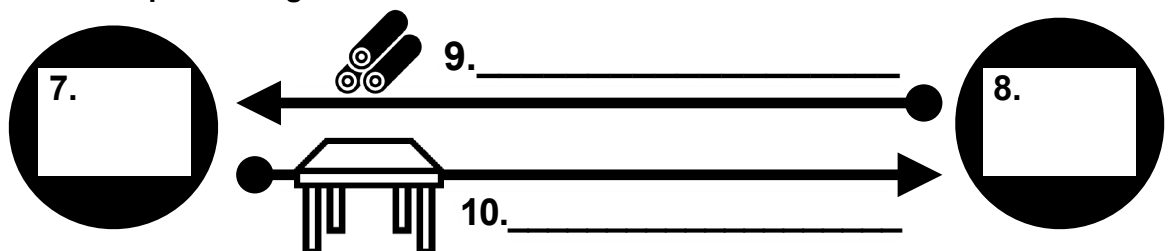

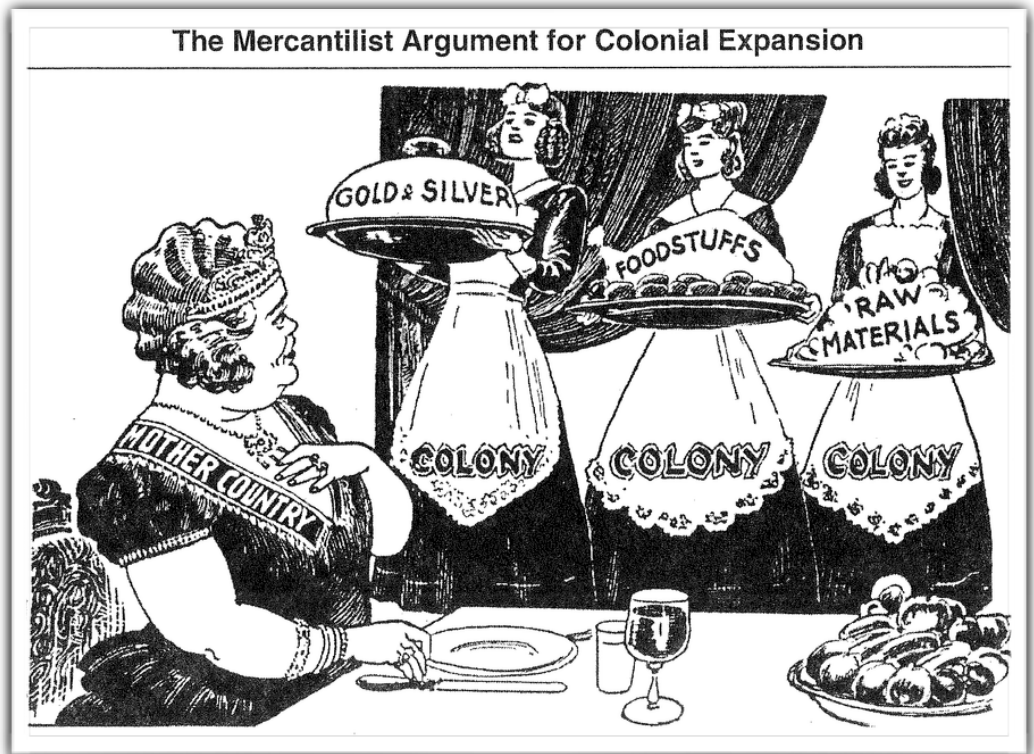
