

## **ON-SIGNERS**

### **1) Before you travel:**

- Passengers are required to visit <https://www.visitjordan.gov.jo> portal prior to departure, complete the required form, and obtain the QR code which is mandatory to be presented prior to boarding and upon arrival
- All passengers must have a negative PCR test conducted within 72 hours prior to departure from the first boarded flight
- Submit Passenger Health Declaration and Locator form before boarding.

#### Exemptions:

- Fully vaccinated Jordanian passengers residing in Jordan where 14 days have passed since their last dose, provided that the period between the travel and return date to Jordan does not exceed 10 days.

### **2) PCR test required upon arrival:**

- PCR test is required upon arrival and each passenger has to register and pay amount of 28 JOD through the <https://www.visitjordan.gov.jo> portal
- In case of positive result, travelers must commit to adhere to home quarantine for a period of 7 days and do the (PCR)(COVID19) test on the seventh day of home quarantine at their own expense. During this application the traveler will sign an indemnity, and failure to comply with the quarantine requirements could result in legal prosecution under the defense order number 16.

#### Exemptions:

- Fully vaccinated passengers.

### **3) Vaccinated Passengers:**

- a) Vaccination certificates proving that full course of vaccination has been completed issued from the following countries are approved: (Australia, Bahrain, Canada, China, EU Countries, Japan, Jordan, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Liechtenstein, Malaysia, Morocco, New Zealand, Oman, Qatar, Russia, South Korea, Switzerland, Taiwan, Tunisia, Turkey, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom and USA).
- b) The vaccination certificate shall be in the Arabic or English language only and presented to airline personnel prior to boarding.

### **4) Health Insurance:**

- Proof of health insurance is mandatory for non-Jordanians.

### **5) Transit Passengers: allowed at Jordanian Airports as follows:**

- PCR test required 72 hours prior to the scheduled time of departure.
- The planned transfer time is not exceeding 10 hrs.

**6) The following shall be applied on passengers travelling to Aqaba (King Hussein International Airport):**

- Passengers shall hold vaccination certificates proving that full course of vaccination has been completed (Minors are exempted from providing vaccination certificate or PCR test if holding a proof that both parents have full course of vaccination), or
- Hold a proof that 21 days have passed after the first dose of covid-19 vaccination, or
- Hold a negative PCR test which was conducted within 72 hours prior to the departure time from the first embarking airport.
- The vaccination certificate shall be in the Arabic or English language only and presented to airline personnel prior to boarding.

**7) Notes:**

- Must provide agent with confirmed E-Ticket & passport copies, seaman books, valid for minimum of 6 months
- Any passenger giving falsified or incorrect information is subject to a fine of 10,000 JOD.
- All arriving passengers from Turkey must provide PCR test from Accredited Labs Only.
- All arriving passengers from Egypt must provide PCR test from the Central Laboratories of the Egyptian Ministry of Health, Reference Labs (Ain Shams Specialized Hospital), Al Borg Labs and Al Mokhtabar Labs.
- All arriving passengers from Erbil must provide PCR test from accredited labs.
- All arriving passengers from Baghdad must provide PCR test from the accredited labs only.

**OFF - SIGNERS**

- Provide agent with confirmed E-Ticket and passport copies, seaman books valid for minimum of 6 months
- PCR test will be taken on board the vessel in Aqaba by a doctor and nurse arranged by agent and result would be ready within 7 to 8 hours
- Off-signers in-transit will be allowed to stay at a hotel in Aqaba (if they are waiting for their flight for example) if their PCR test taken on the vessel when the vessel arrives in Aqaba is negative or may proceed directly to the airport in Aqaba or Amman.
- Agent needs to obtain letters of approval from:
  - a. Jordan Maritime Commission & Governor of Aqaba
  - b. After the approval obtained from the Governor of Aqaba, agent provides the Jordan National Epidemics Committee in the Health Directorate with a copy of the approval.
  - c. A copy of the approval letter of the Governor of Aqaba and the negative result of the examination is reviewed by the Aqaba Borders and Passports Directorate and the Aqaba Borders Intelligence Directorate to complete the procedures for stamping the passport.
