The health declaration is needed for all travelers **0 years and older**.

What is considered a valid vaccination card from the ABC-Islands?



- The vaccination card has been issued on Aruba, Curaçao or Bonaire.
- The original issued card as proof of vaccination. No (scaled) copies.
- The card shows you are fully vaccinated when:
You have received two corona vaccination shots. The last shot was set at least two weeks ago.
or
You have received one shot and you have had coronavirus.
