

Traveling to Bonaire from very high- risk countries

Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, French Guiana, Guyana, India, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Suriname, Uruguay, Venezuela, South Africa

Present upon arrival on Bonaire



Negative coronavirus test result

NAAT(PCR) test within 24 hours before departure.

OR



NAAT(PCR) test within 72 hours before arrival.
+ Antigen-test at arrival on Bonaire.

Travelers under the age of 13 are not required to present a negative test result.



Health Declaration

All travelers to Bonaire must fill in a Health Declaration online at www.bonairepublichealth.org between 72 and 48 hours before departure. **This is required for all travelers aged 0 years and older.**



Quarantine



Have you been to one or more of the countries mentioned above before arriving on Bonaire? If so, then you must go into home quarantine or quarantine at your holiday address for 10 days, provided that the location is suitable for quarantine. If the holiday address is not suitable, you may choose another address at your own expense. The Public Health Department can assist with this.

On day 5 of quarantine you may undergo a PCR test free of charge at the Public Health Department test lane (*note: the day of arrival is day 0*). The Public Health Department will contact you about this on day 4 of your quarantine.

The Public Health Department will call you as soon as the test result is known. If the test result is negative, you may leave quarantine. If the result is positive, you will have to go into isolation. You will receive detailed information about this from the Public Health Department.
