Event Description: The Colorado Mini Classic goes big in 2013! With racing for juniors aged 10-18 and U23 Men, this is the premier development multi-stage race in the region. The Overall Winners will be determined by Points, not Time. The Mini Classic is a USAC sanctioned event and a USAC license is required to race. A license can be obtained online at www.usacycling.org.

Registration: only available online at www.madsync.com. Registration closes Wednesday, May 22, 2013. No on-site or race-day registration.

Entry Fee: \$50 per rider for BRAC Members, \$75 for non-BRAC Members. Join BRAC with an annual membership and support local Colorado racing! Entry fee includes three races, all race fees, insurance, and a pizza party for racers and families on Saturday night. No refunds or cancellations. Race held rain or shine.

Packet Pickup: Riders can pick up their racing packet, including race numbers and Race Technical Guide at the Holiday Inn Express.

Silt is located on I-70 in Western Colorado, just 7 miles west of New Castle.

Course Descriptions:

Time Trial: Saturday. A traditional Out and Back, wide open TT course on the I-70 frontage road. Wind will surely play a role in this event – it's time to be mentally strong.

Road Race: Sunday. The Start/Finish is in Veteran's Park in Silt. Younger racers race a 14 mile lap, and older racers get an 18 mile lap with additional climbing. Both courses include a challenging climb from the start, numerous rolling hills, and a twisting descent back into town. This is a true all-rounder's race course with fantastic views of the valley and Grand Mesa!

Criterion: Monday. The course winds around Veteran's Park in Silt. A technical, flat course with 8 turns (approx. 0.8 miles). The park offers shade and green space for spectators and families.

Awards: Final GC Awards will be presented at Veteran's Park on Monday at the conclusion of the day's racing.
