Search this passage for the answers.

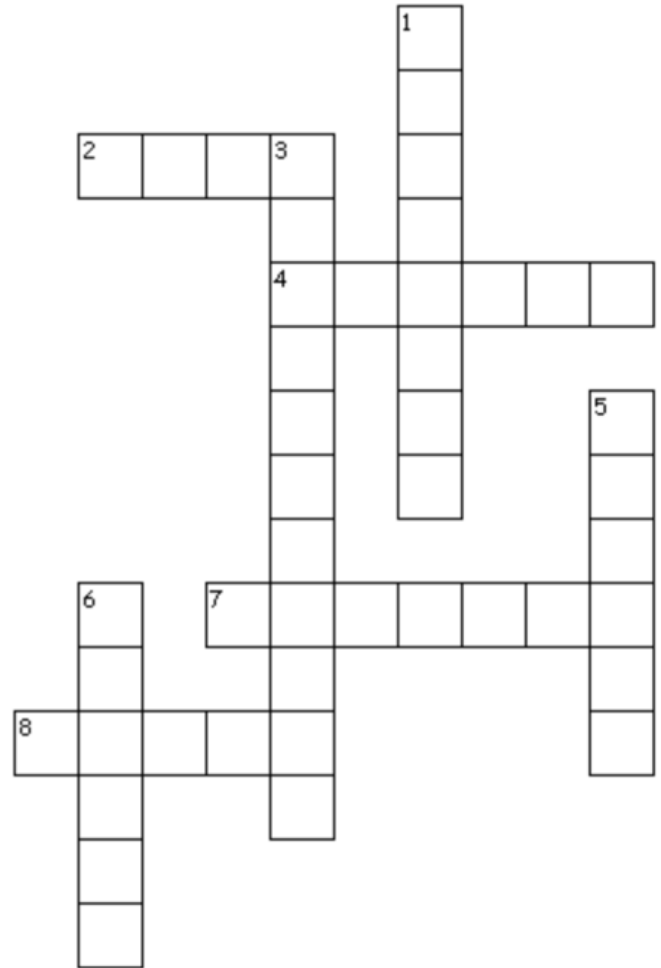

THANK: Thank the Lord that we can count on the Bible being true! Share with God how grateful you are that when you are sad, He will listen.



Day 2: Reread Psalm 119:25-32

The writer of this Psalm is feeling very sad, because things are hard. He also feels like a failure, but how wise he is to pray when he feels this way. Do you ever feel like that? When we do, we should turn to the Lord too, and He is faithful to listen. Just like the writer, we should ask God to show us His ways and help us to understand His wondrous works and precepts, even if our soul is really sad. He can give us strength or enlarge our heart!

CONFESS: Spend time telling God your need for His Word and for His help to obey His commands. Do you struggle sometimes feeling sorry for yourself? I know I do, but that doesn't help us or glorify God. Tell the Lord that you need Him to teach you His lessons even in hard times.

Day 3: Read Micah 5:2 & Matthew 2:1

Read these passages – a verse from the Old Testament and one from the New Testament. 400 years before Jesus was even born in Bethlehem, the prophet Micah told the people of Israel that He would be born there. These verses are just one example of 332 Old Testament prophecies that Jesus proved to be true. That is amazing! We can trust in God’s Word, because He proves it to be true. There are promises God has made about the future that we can count on. One of those is that Jesus will come back to take His church to heaven with Him. We want to be with Him in that future day.

PRAISE: Spend time telling God how grateful you are that His Bible is true. Thank Him for all the fulfilled promises from God’s Word and that we can count on His Word.

Day 4: Reread Psalm 119:25-32

The writer asks that the Lord put false ways or lying far from him. Sometimes it is tempting to lie to get out of trouble or to make us look better or get what we want. Telling lies hurts us and others and makes God sad. Sometimes it takes courage to be truthful. When people tell us lies it makes it hard for us to trust them and hurts our hearts.

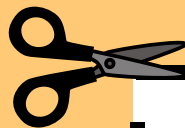
Name a time that you told a lie.

PRAY: Ask God to forgive you for lying. Thank God that He doesn’t lie to us, but His Word is true. Thank God that He can help us be more truthful or protect us from others’ lies.
