


# THE BIBLE GIVES WISDOM - 3.20



**God's Word helps us know what is right and choose to do it!**

Day 1: Read Psalm 119:65-72

Complete this maze! As you do, think about how the Bible helps us find wisdom and know which way to go.



**THANK:** Praise God for His Word that gives us wisdom! Thank Him that His law is better than thousands of gold and silver pieces!

Day 2: Read Proverbs 1:1-7

Proverbs was written by King Solomon, who was the wise son of King David. Wisdom is knowing the difference between what is right and what is wrong according to God and then living out that knowledge. In this section of Proverbs, Solomon shares that the beginning of wisdom is found in the fear or regard of the Lord, which mean understanding who God is and His place as Lord over all. He is clear to share that "fools despise wisdom and discipline". We don't want to be fools, but instead counted as wise ones.

**CONFESS:** Tell God about a time that you have known what to do, but you have chosen not to live that out. Confess also the times that you have not wanted wisdom or discipline that teaches.

**Day 3: Reread Psalm 119:65-72**

The writer says in verse 67 that before he was afflicted, he went astray. Being afflicted means that he suffered in some way. We don't know how he suffered, but his suffering or affliction created a change in him for the good. He also didn't blame God for his hard times. He remembered that God is good and does good. In verse 71, he says that it was good for him to suffer, because he learned God's truth from it. Can you imagine calling hard times or affliction good? It is always good when we learn! Name a time that you went through something hard and learned something good from it.

**ASK:** Ask God to help you learn wisdom without going through suffering or hard times. However, when you do go through difficulty – as all of us will – ask the Lord to help you learn good things from it and to remember that He is good.

**Day 4: Reread Psalm 119:65-72**

In verse 66, the writer asks the Lord to teach him good judgement and knowledge. He believed in God's commandments. With his whole heart, he kept God's precepts and teachings. That means that his heart was totally committed to obeying the Lord. He was convinced of God's goodness and the delight of God's law. What great encouragement for us too!

**PRAY:** Pray that God will grow your love for His Word. Ask Him to help you follow God and His commands with your whole heart!

**Day 5 & 6: Practice your memory verse.**
