NRDAR = Natural Resource Damage Assessment and Restoration

- Department of Interior program (CERCLA, Clean Water Act, Oil Pollution Act), state and federal agencies act as trustees of natural resources for the public
- Cooperative Process
- Purpose = restoration of injured resources and services
 - Determine the amount/extent of injury to trust resources
Including: air, water, land, fish, wildlife
 - Restore injured natural resources and services they provide
