# Consecration Sunday is Coming - October 29!





Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial

contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes. St. Mary's Vestry has selected the New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in

our stewardship education emphasis. New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?" Each Sunday of October, we will have a guest speaker during the announcements period of our service. Then, on Consecration Sunday, October 29th, we will have a guest preacher, the Rev. Eric Mills, who serves as the Rector of St. Philip's Episcopal Church in Southport, NC. Father Eric will include a brief period of instruction and inspiration, concluding with an opportunity for members to make their commitments as a confidential act of worship. Every attendee and member who completes an Estimate of Giving Card does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday, either online or in-person. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card. We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. Thank you in advance for your enthusiastic participation in Consecration Sunday!

## Farewell from Organist & Choirmaster Sharon Veitch

After serving for over twelve years at St. Peter's by-the-sea Episcopal Church in Swansboro, NC, God called me to serve in Kinston, NC for seven years as St. Mary's Organist and Choirmaster. With over fifty years of service as an organist and choirmaster to multiple denominations, including military installations, I sense the call of God to begin the next chapter in His service. My last Sunday of service at St. Mary's will be October 22, 2023.

The privilege and honor of serving at St. Mary's is a treasure and memory that will be carried in my heart as I move on to serve our God in the way He will direct. It has been a blessing to be part of your lives through providing piano, voice, and dance lessons, duets with Ily, weekly Sunday Eucharists, weddings, baptisms, funerals, memorial services, ordinations, consecrations, graduations, choir, handbells, children's music, Evensongs, St. Mary's Day, Advent, Christmas Eve, Holy Week, Saturday Vigil, Easter Sunday, Pentecost, and our beloved, The Boar's Head Festival. Oh, so many memories....

There were difficult times during my service at St. Mary's. Those difficult times included COVID which brought challenges to the music ministry and navigating ministry on all fronts; time spent visiting my mother until she was called home to be with God; a time of physical pain and finally, having surgery and recuperation necessary for a healthy return to St. Mary's; and the rigorous road of study and practice for the degree of Doctor of Sacred Music. time immediately following. All are welcome!




# St. Francis of Assisi Celebrate the Feast Day with a Blessing of the Animals
