


# **April 2023** St. Mary's Episcopal Church: Serving with JOY! The Bell Ringer Online at www.stmaryskinston.com

# From the Rector

# An Invitation to the Rite of Reconciliation:

### All may, some should, none must.

"Reconciliation of a Penitent, or Penance, is the rite in which those who repent of their sins may confess them to God in the presence of a priest, and receive the assurance of pardon and the grace of absolution." ~ The Book of Common Prayer, p. 859

The Rite of Reconciliation, also known as Confession or Penance, is a sacramental rite in the Episcopal Church. In the Episcopal Church, penance is not mandatory before receiving Eucharist as it is in some traditions, though a corporate confession of sin is part of every service of the Holy Eucharist, with an absolution of sin following.

There may be times in our lives when we feel the need to more fully experience God's grace and forgiveness. At these times a private confession to a priest can be helpful. God already knows our sins even before we speak them, but it is a helpful practice for our spiritual formation to spend time contemplating our sins and confessing them in the presence of others as it helps us to have greater clarity about our thoughts and actions. The season of Lent, which is a penitential season, is a good time to do this. Anything disclosed to a priest in the context of confession is confidential. Father Tom is available to hear confessions by appointment.



Safe Harbor

Recently, I traveled to Depoe Bay, Oregon for Coast Guard Reserve duty. It was part of my final work trip before my retirement from the Coast Guard at the end of May. I can't verify this, but it has been claimed that Depoe Bay is the smallest natural and navigable harbor in the world. What I can verify is that Depoe Bay is breathtaking in its natural beauty and that the harbor truly is a haven of refuge and safety from the oftensavage conditions of the Pacific Ocean on the other side of the breakers. I marveled at images around town of small boats traversing the narrow 50-ft wide channel, being covered with the dangerous waters. It makes a lot of sense for there to be a Coast Guard Station in Depoe Bay! And it is also no wonder that the concept of a harbor has been a meaningful illustration to convey the life of faith in Christ Jesus.

Friends, we are about to enter into Holy Week. In Holy Week, we are invited to walk the way of the cross, and find in it that we are not alone in our suffering. And not only that, but Easter reminds us that the suffering of this world will not be the final experience of God's creation. Out of perfect love, Jesus has walked the worst path of pain and has promised that redemption and total healing is what God offers as a gift to all. I wonder if the image of Depoe Bay might be helpful to you today as you consider the stormy conditions around and within. Jesus invites us to come to Him and to take refuge. The Way that He walks is not easy, but it leads to fullness of life, and there is peace to be found in that promise. I pray that this Holy Week & Easter season will be helpful in your hearing and receiving this Good News. I am grateful to God for the privilege of walking The Way with you.



# Vestry Meeting Highlights



### **Clergy Sabbatical This Summer**

Just as God gave the sabbath commandment for rest and spiritual growth, the church has a tradition of granting clergy sabbaticals: *limited periods when a pastor steps away from the roles and responsibilities of parish life for physical and spiritual rest and renewal.* For several months, St. Mary's vestry and Fr. Tom have been at work on sabbatical plans for this summer. More details will be shared in the coming weeks, but in the meantime please hold in your prayers the development of these plans as we work to make this a JOYful

time of revitalization. Additionally, at its March meeting, the Vestry approved the allocation of some capital reserve funds to proceed with plans to paint the 2nd floor classrooms for the first time in more than 30 years, and begin an improvement to church door security and the installation of a fire alarm system.

Mary's Kitchen Food Drive & **Quarterly Service** Date








### **Good Friday Offering**
