

From the Rector

Dear Partners in the Gospel of Christ at St. Mary's,

It is with great appreciation that I have worked with our vestry, staff, and other parish leaders over this last year to plan and prepare for the time of clergy sabbatical that is to begin at the end of this month. Along with some vacation time, I will be away from the church from May 29 until September 5. I am writing to share some of these plans with you all.

First, it is important to me that I am clear that the purpose of this sabbatical is not to search for another call to serve in ministry elsewhere. I continue to cherish the season of ministry to which God has called us to live and serve together here at St. Mary's! Additionally, I am not burned out, though admittedly, I am tired and welcome this opportunity to rest.

The purpose of a sabbatical is exactly that: rest and renewal in Christ. One definition of sabbatical that I have found helpful is that it is a string of *consecutive sabbath days during which one fasts from work in order to rest in God's work and learn to live in Jesus' easy yoke every day.* In the biblical understanding of sabbath, it is a time of resting and renewing in God, from which our work eventually comes forth. So, sabbath isn't a day to recover from overworking. It is meant to be a time for us to rest, first, in God's presence so that we can then do our work and live in the overflow of God's love for us.

The vision that I have sensed that God has given me for this sabbatical includes days for healing, celebration, prayer, play, worship, intentional nurturing of family relationships, and enjoying gifts of creation (especially music & food). These pursuits will help me be forward-thinking so that I can live well into the next chapter of our season of ministry. I look forward to sharing more details about the plans for me and my family at the Wednesday Night Supper on **Wednesday evening, May 24**, but part of these plans include time to travel together (including a road trip to Seattle for Holly, the boys, & me) in order to be truly present with each other and observe together the gifts of God's creation and cultures around us. I will also be taking an extended time to be 'in residence' away from Kinston for a particular focus on prayer, immersion in Scripture, study, spiritual direction, and other forms of self-care.

Other clergy and friends have advised me about the difficulty of stepping away completely from priestly and pastoral duties and have emphasized that in order to have a true sabbatical, it's very necessary that I disengage from regular communication with the parish (not an easy task for mel). So to prevent myself from checking email or phone messages, I will change my email password to some random series of numbers and letters that I won't be able to remember, write it down on an index card, and give it to Holly. She will give it back to me shortly before my return to my Church Study.

In the meantime, plans and procedures have been carefully put together for the continuance of the church's vibrant mission and ministry. Your vestry committee leaders, other ministry leaders, and the parish staff are well equipped for this time, but will benefit greatly from your supportive patience and grace as they exercise new forms of leadership. We have also worked hard to bring together a varied and capable group of visiting ministers as well as members of St. Mary's to preach and lead our Sunday liturgies - the full schedule will be shared soon! The Rev. Canon Mollie Roberts and our own Fr. Greg Smith will be on-call clergy for pastoral situations that may arise. And our Senior Warden, Vicki Kennedy, will be the primary point of contact for any outstanding parish leadership needs during this time.

As we look ahead to the beginning of this sabbatical time, please also mark your calendars for the Adult Forum hour on **Pentecost Sunday morning**, **May 28** during which we will be discussing worship, fellowship, and other ministry plans here at St. Mary's throughout the summertime. Then, later that morning, **our 10:30am liturgy** will include a time of commissioning of our vestry and other leaders for this sabbatical, as well as prayers for us all during this time.

May God continue to bless and work powerfully through the people of St. Mary's Church.

entecost is a Principle Feast Day of the church, celebrated on the seventh Sunday after Easter. This year, Pentecost is May 28th.



While there is an ancient Jewish holiday of the same name. for Christians. Pentecost commemorates the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Apostles and other followers of Jesus while they were in Jerusalem observing the Jewish custom. Because the Holy Spirit has inspired the spread of the Good News of Iesus to the world, Pentecost is often understood to be the birthday of the Church. Happy Birthday!!! On this day, the clergy wear RED vestments, and the altar will be adorned with red hangings. It is even customary for the people of the congregation to wear RED as well.

Adult Christian Formation WHO ARE THE SAINTS?


