Dear RUMC Family,

I took my first theology class as a college freshman. At 18, I was annoyingly earnest and completely oblivious to the ways that this class would challenge so many of the things I already thought I knew - starting with my understanding of Jesus. As pre-reading for the class, we were assigned Philip Yancey's *The Jesus I Never Knew*, along with an article about a man named Albert Schweitzer, who a hundred years earlier had set out on a personal quest to discover the "historical Jesus." The catalyst for the quest? His realization that the world's view of Jesus had changed throughout the centuries - influenced more by current events and evolving perspectives than by the lens of Jesus' own 1st-century context and culture. In other words, he noticed that we humans tend to make Jesus in our own image.

Upon reading this, my first reaction was to get defensive. "I haven't done that!" I thought. "The Jesus that I follow is the *real* Jesus - not some composite of the Bible and my own perspective." But then I read Yancey's book, which included a lot of perspectives about Jesus I had never considered - and some I didn't really connect with. I finally had to own the fact that, sometimes, the Jesus whose voice I imagine in my head sounds a lot like me.

This is a perennial challenge faced by followers of Jesus. How do we avoid the temptation to make Jesus in our image? How do we even recognize when we're doing it? In my own faith journey, I've come to the conclusion that if I don't feel challenged by Jesus - and if the Jesus in my head agrees with everything I think - then I'm probably not following the right Jesus. After all, Jesus was arrested and put to death for disrupting the status quo and announcing a kingdom that was in conflict with the kingdoms of his day. His message challenged even the most devout people of God. He was a radical and a rebel.

I want to invite you to join us this Lent as we allow ourselves to be challenged by this revolutionary Savior and embrace the values of his revolutionary kingdom. We'll begin the season of Lent on Ash Wednesday, with services at noon and 7:00 p.m. Then we'll embark on a journey of study and exploration, using Mike Slaughter's book, *Revolutionary Kingdom: Following the Rebel Jesus*, as our guide. Stay tuned for more details!

We (the Sisterhood) had the Gingerbread House competition on December 11.

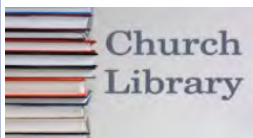
We only had two entries.

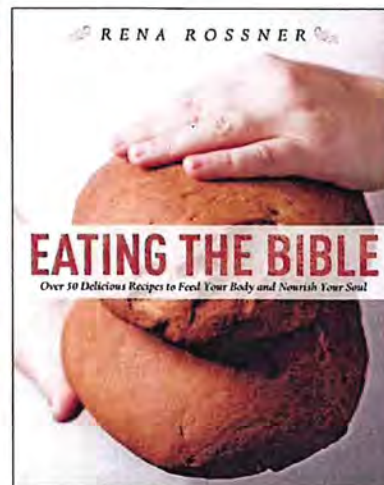
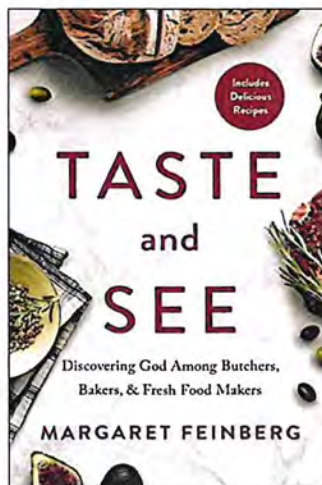

Acolyte Schedule

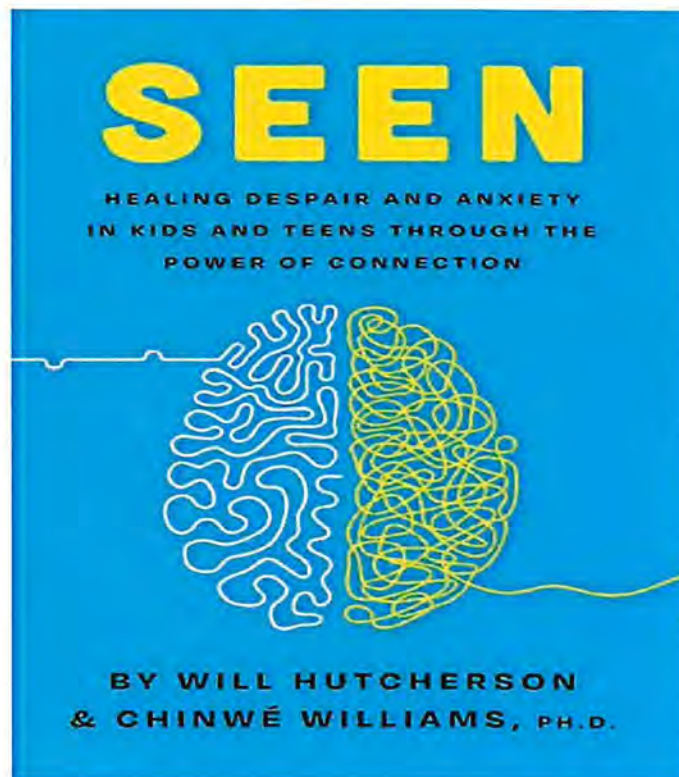
Being an acolyte is a service of honor to God and to the Reisterstown UMC community.

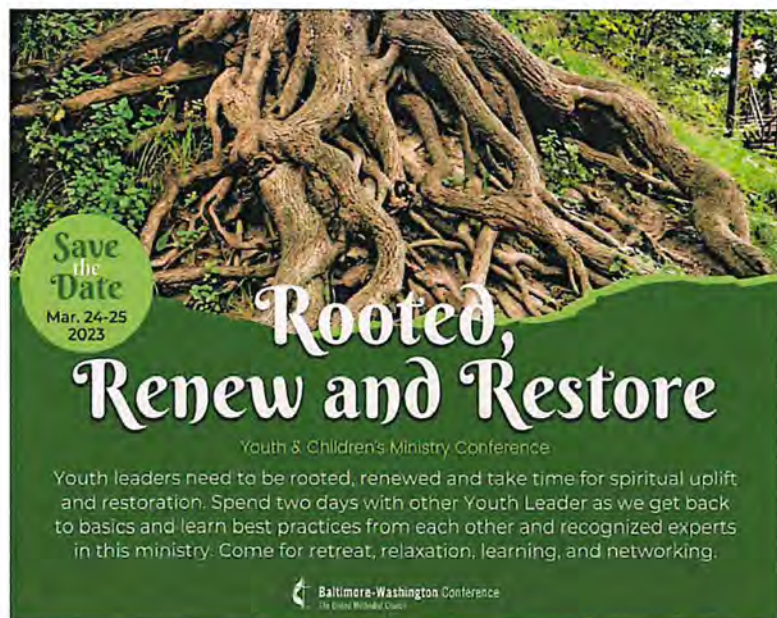
