Dear RUMC Family,

I'm planning a road trip for this summer. It's the kind that involves multiple destinations and types of lodging, including tent camping and at least one hostel - something I haven't done since having kids. Yet as much as I might plan, and despite my best intentions, experience has told me that journeys like this don't always go as planned. Flexibility is key. Adapting is a must. And persevering through the changes and the unexpected twists and turns? It's often rewarding in ways I couldn't have planned for.

If you are reading this at the beginning of March, we are already a week into the season of Lent - a 40-day season (not including Sundays) that invites us on an intentional journey with Jesus toward His cross, so that we might

experience more fully the joy of His resurrection. For centuries, it has been the tradition for Christians to take on disciplines of prayer, fasting - whether from certain foods or other comforts - and almsgiving (the act of giving to those in need). By taking on these disciplines, we learn to identify with Jesus' posture of self-denial and to rely on God's strength over our own.

But if experience has taught me anything, even Lenten journeys don't always go as planned. While we might begin the season of Lent with the best of intentions - with expectations about how it will go - we might discover we don't resonate with a particular spiritual practice or that the pull toward old habits is much stronger than we realized. If any of this describes you, I want to encourage you to stick with the journey. Perhaps instead of a singular spiritual practice, you adjust your plans and instead explore a new one each week. Or, if you've gotten behind in your daily Bible readings, maybe you carve out some extra time in a cozy spot to catch up. Even if you have to adjust your "itinerary," the important thing is not to abandon it. And hey, if you're late getting started? Even a delayed journey is one worth taking.

So friends, let us continue our journey with Jesus - even if we encounter twists and turns and bumps along the way. As we travel throughout this season of Lent, may we experience God's gifts to the fullest, and on Easter, may our souls know the joy of resurrected life.





👺 Hi everyone,

After searching for a new home for us since September, I heard back from the last 2 hopes I had. They told me that they could not host us, so unfortunately we will be closing. St. Thomas just had too much that needed to be done to the basement to make it usable and the Presbytery said they do not have any position that could act as a Liaison between us and them for the use of the space. While I am very sad that this journey and mission with you all has come to an end, I am also trying to just be grateful to God that I got to know all of you and spend this time together doing God's work in Reisterstown.

So, in the next couple weeks we will be clearing out our rooms and donating our supplies. If you have any ideas of where things should go or know of any needs in the community, let me know. I will keep all our new toys and craft supplies to give to Eileen and the Community Crisis Center for the holiday season this year, NESAP was mentioned as a good place to donate a lot of our current used toys to be gone through, and I have asked United Church and Horizon Church if they need anything. Some of my family and people from Horizon will help us move out on Tuesday late afternoon/evening, so the heavy lifting and cleaning out of our rooms is taken care of.

In March/Early April, I am planning to have a final gathering/lunch/closing celebration. Once the cleanout is finished, I will start planning that so I will let you all know the date when I set it. It will be on a Tuesday I think, so let me know if there are any Tuesdays that do not work for you all.

All in all, we helped an average of 340 kids a year directly the past 29 years at Northminster. Which does not include all the extra toys we sent out at the end of Shopping week to various Nonprofits for their own families they support. This comes out to around 9000 kids in the past 29 years (not including the extras) and likely thousands more from when Mrs. Sykes was in charge. The amount of good we have done in this community for God is such a blessing and I am so thankful to have worked alongside you all.

With this hard news, let's pray. God, words cannot express how deeply grateful I am to You throughout our time in this mission. The people we have gotten to know have changed us for the better and we will always carry memories of them with us. We are sad and mourning the loss of this mission, but know that Your Will will be done throughout this process. As we mourn the loss, keep bringing to mind all the good memories to sustain us and let the changes we have gone through doing your work, carry on to the next parts of our lives. God, I don't fully understand all this but I have faith that it will be turned into something for your good that will bring about your kingdom here in Reisterstown. Thank you, Amen.
