




Please read The It Girl by Ruth Ware. Mark Church your calendar for our next meeting. September Library 20th at 11 am or September 21st at 7pm in the Library

#### What you need:


- · 12 small, smooth rocks

#### What you do:


- Clean the rocks and egg carton. Place newspaper on a table to protect it from paint.
