Today's Bible Hero Adventure

Today we are starting our new series, *Bible Heroes*. God is the hero of every story, but He also uses His people to accomplish big things. Over the next few weeks, we will meet people God used to help His people and bring Him glory.

Today we meet Joseph, the son of Jacob. Joseph's father loved him, but his brothers became upset after he shared some dreams. They sold him into slavery, and he was later thrown into prison. But God had big plans and would use it all for good. One day Pharaoh had a dream no one could explain. When Joseph was asked to help, God showed him the meaning: there would be seven years of plenty followed by seven years of famine. Joseph told Pharaoh to choose someone to manage the food, and Pharaoh placed Joseph in charge.

Joseph stored food during the good years, and when the famine came, people from all over came to Egypt. Even his brothers came for food. Instead of being angry, Joseph told them what they intended for evil, God used for good. God is the ultimate hero of this story. He placed Joseph in the right position at the right time and used him to provide for His people in a big way.

Hero Training at Home

Ask your child to help you put away the groceries. Where does our food come from? How did God provide food for the people during the famine? Does God still provide for us today?
