## Today's Bible Hero Adventure .....

Naomi lived in Bethlehem, but when a famine came her family moved to Moab. While there, Naomi's husband and two sons died. Her sons had married women from Moab, Ruth and Orpah. Naomi told them to stay in Moab, but Ruth loved Naomi and God, so she went with her to Bethlehem.

At harvest time, Ruth gathered leftover grain in the fields of a man named Boaz. When Boaz heard about Ruth's kindness to Naomi, he showed kindness to her and made sure she was cared for. Naomi told Ruth that Boaz was a family redeemer, someone who could rescue and provide for their family. Boaz wanted to marry Ruth, but first asked another relative who had the first choice. That man refused, so Boaz married Ruth and continued to care for her and Naomi.

Both Ruth and Boaz showed Bible Hero characteristics. Ruth showed love and loyalty, Boaz showed kindness and redemption, but as always, the true hero was God. God had a plan to provide for Ruth and Naomi, and through Ruth's family came King David—and one day, Jesus!

# Hero Training at Home

Take a family walk, choosing one person to be the *leader*. Like Ruth followed Naomi, everyone in the family must follow the *leader* wherever they go and even walk, skip, jump, in the same way. Encourage everyone to say, "Where you go, I will go." Then talk about what it might have been like for Ruth to follow Naomi and what it means for us to follow Jesus.
