Today we learn about a Bible hero named Samson. When his mom was pregnant, God told her never to cut his hair because her son would be set apart and God would use him to help His people. The Israelites had disobeyed God and were under the rule of the Philistines, but God planned to use Samson to bring victory.

As Samson grew older, God gave him great strength to do amazing things like tearing apart a lion, tying torches to foxes' tails, and winning battles against men. His strength wasn't from himself but from God, who had a big plan for him. Still, Samson was far from perfect. His girlfriend Delilah was paid by the Philistines to learn the secret of his strength. After lying to her three times, Samson finally told her the truth. While he slept, she cut off his hair, and when the Philistines came, Samson had no strength to fight them. They captured him, blinded him, and brought him into their temple.

It might have seemed like all hope was gone, but Samson prayed and asked God to give him strength one more time. God answered, and when Samson pushed against the pillars, the whole temple crashed down, destroying the Philistines inside. God is the ultimate hero, but He used Samson to bring victory when he trusted Him.
