### Trail Stop Recap

God brought the Israelites out of Egypt, provided food and water for them, and led them to Mount Sinai. After they stayed at Mount Sinai for about a year, God's presence lifted from the Tabernacle and led them away from the mountain. The Israelites continued to follow God on their journey to the Promised Land.

The journey was not easy, and once again the Israelites began to complain. God continued to provide manna for them to eat, but the people grew tired of it and grumbled that they had no food. God heard their complaining and sent venomous snakes among them. When a person was bitten, it caused great pain and even death.

The people came to Moses and asked him to pray to God to take the snakes away. Moses prayed, and God heard him, but instead of removing the snakes, God told Moses to make a bronze snake and place it on a pole. Anyone who looked at the bronze snake after being bitten would be healed and live.

Many years later, Jesus reminded the people of this story. He explained that just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, He would be lifted up on the cross. An Israelite who was bitten and looked at the bronze snake was saved from physical death, but anyone who looks to Jesus and puts their trust in Him will be saved and receive eternal life.

### Continuing on the Trail at Home

Take a family drive around town to look at Christmas lights and decorations. Christmas is a time to celebrate Jesus. Remind your child that just as God rescued the Israelites from the snakes, Jesus came to rescue us from our sin. As you are looking at Christmas lights, challenge everyone to look for Christmas displays that celebrate Jesus!
