God promised to send a Savior because He loves us.

Application I can celebrate and worship Jesus, God's promised Savior, because He loves me.

The Promise Lesson Summary

"And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel."

Genesis 3:15

Christmas is a time to celebrate the birth of our Savior, who came to make a way for us to live with Him forever.

In the beginning, God created a beautiful and perfect home where His people lived with Him and spent time with Him. But sin broke that perfect home. Because of sin, God's people could no longer live in His presence, and life became difficult. Yet right away, God made a promise to send a Savior–Jesus–who would defeat sin and make things right again.

Many years later, the angel Gabriel came to Mary and told her she would soon have a baby named Jesus. He would be the Son of God, and His kingdom would never end. The name *Jesus* means "Yahweh saves." From the very beginning, God had a plan to rescue His people, restore their relationship with Him, and one day bring them into a perfect forever home with Him.

This Christmas season, let's celebrate our Savior who came down from His throne in Heaven to make a way for us to know Him, walk with Him, and one day live forever with Him.
