Application

When I need help, I can go to Jesus.

Lesson Summary

One day, when Jesus returned to His hometown of Capernaum, He was welcomed by a large crowd of people. Among the crowd were two people who desperately needed Jesus' help. A synagogue leader had a very sick daughter and he came to Jesus, pleading with Him to come to his house and heal her. As Jesus began walking toward the man's home, He was surrounded by the crowd. Suddenly, Jesus stopped because He knew someone had touched Him who needed healing.

A woman in the crowd had been sick for a very long time, but she had faith that Jesus could heal her. She reached out and touched His cloak, and immediately she was healed. Jesus asked who had touched Him, and the woman came forward and explained why she had touched Him and how she had been healed.

Just then, someone came from the synagogue leader's house and said that his daughter had died. Jesus looked at the girl's father and told him not to be afraid, saying the girl was only sleeping. When Jesus went into the house, He took the girl by the hand and told her to get up. Immediately, the girl stood up and began eating.

Both the woman in the crowd and the synagogue leader had heard of Jesus' power and trusted that He could fight their battles. Jesus is powerful, and He has all authority. He is in control of all things, and when we are scared or worried, we can come to Him with confidence, knowing He will fight our battles.

Anchor the Lesson at Home

Even in a huge crowd of people, Jesus cared for the two people who came to Him. Jesus cares for each of us. He knows our needs and when we come to Him, we can be confident He hears us and He will fight our battles.
