## Journey Through God's Word

It was now time for Moses to go to Pharaoh, but still Moses didn't think he should be the one to speak to Pharaoh. After all, he didn't speak well, but nothing would stop God's plan.

God told Moses that his brother Aaron would be the one to talk to Pharaoh. God also said that He would harden Pharaoh's heart. Even though God would show His power to Pharaoh, he still wouldn't let the Israelites leave. However, God would show His power many times to Pharaoh and the people of Egypt. Once they saw His power, they would know He alone is God and Pharaoh would let His people go. Moses and Aaron did what the Lord said and just as He had said, Pharaoh didn't listen. God was faithful to do what He said and He began to show His power throughout Egypt. Pharaoh still wasn't ready to let the Israelites go, but God wasn't done yet. God had been faithful to do what He said and everything was happening just as God said it would. God had said after Pharaoh and all of Egypt saw His power, Pharaoh would let the Israelites go. God is always faithful and we can trust Him to do what He says. Next week we will see how He was faithful to bring His people out of Egypt.

## Journey Together at Home

Ask your child who was stronger, Pharaoh or God? Talk about how God is powerful and always does what He says. This week, remind your child they can trust God when things feel hard. Practice saying the Bible verse together.
