DIGGING DEEPER

EARLY CHILDHOOD



As you drive, play a simple game of **"Who Did God Use?"** Name people from the Bible your child has learned about and see what they remember about how God used each person. Remind them that God can use ordinary people to do what He has planned. Talk about one way your family can follow, obey, or serve God today.



As you eat together, ask everyone to share one way they saw God help or care for them today. Talk about how the people in *Rise Up* were ordinary people who needed God's help, just like we do. Thank God for being faithful and ask Him to help your family trust and obey Him.



Before bed, ask your child to name one of the leaders they have learned about and something God did through that person. Remind them that none of God's leaders were perfect, but God was always faithful to His people. Pray together, thanking God for sending Jesus, our perfect King, and asking Him to help your child follow Jesus each day.



When your child makes a good choice, shows courage, helps someone, or even makes a mistake, use the moment to point them back to God. Remind them that the leaders in the Bible did not always get everything right either, but God continued to work out His good plans. Encourage your child that they can trust God, obey His Word, and depend on Him to help them do what is right.
