Bible Passage Joshua 2-4

Main Point

God sets leaders in place.

Application

I can trust and obey God.

Today's Discovery

God had raised up Joshua to lead His people, and after Moses died, it was time for Joshua to lead the Israelites into the Promised Land. God reminded Joshua to be strong and courageous because He would be with him wherever he went. He also told Joshua to obey His Word, and the Lord would help him lead His people.

Joshua obeyed the Lord and prepared the Israelites to cross the Jordan River. Before entering the land, he sent two spies to the city of Jericho. There, they met Rahab. She hid the spies and told them she believed the Lord would give the Israelites the land because everyone in Jericho had heard about God's mighty power. The spies promised to protect Rahab and her family. When they returned, they confidently told Joshua that the Lord would give Israel the land He had promised.

Then it was time for the Israelites to cross the Jordan River. Just as God had made a way through the Red Sea, He made a way through the Jordan River, and the Israelites crossed on dry ground. Once again, God showed He is faithful to always keep His promises and we can trust Him wherever He leads us.

As you drive or walk somewhere this week, point out how you trust roads, bridges, and signs to help you reach your destination. Explain that Joshua trusted God to lead His people, even when they couldn't see exactly what would happen next. Thank God together that we can trust Him to lead us every day.
