In Exodus 3:1-14, we read about the call of Moses by God. Moses had been in the courts of Pharaoh for 40 years, and after that, he was a shepherd for 40 years. Moses was a shepherd at the time he saw a burning bush that wasn't consumed by the fire. When Moses walked to the bush, God started speaking to Moses through it. God frequently would use fire as a sign of His presence in the Old Testament. God told Moses He wanted to deliver the Israelites from the awful situations they were living through in Egypt. God would provide a promised land for them in Canaan. The Promised Land was part of the Abrahamic Covenant God had given to Abraham back in Genesis 12 and 15. Moses wasn't always sure of his ability to accomplish this huge challenge. God promised Moses He would personally be with him as he led the Israelites out of Egypt and toward the Promised Land. When we put our trust in the Lord, we can know God will always be with us through His Spirit, just as He was with Moses. In John 14:16-17, we see how God is always with His children, no matter what we may face. We have a confident hope in God that He will never leave us or forsake us!



