THE PROMISES OF GOD

Lesson Summary:

In Genesis 12:1-9 and Genesis 15, we read about the special promises God made to Abraham. God promised three big things: First, that Abraham's family would become a great nation. Second, that his family would be given the land of Canaan (the Promised Land). Third, that **all the families of the earth would be blessed through Him**. This last promise points to Jesus Christ, because through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, people from all nations can be saved.

These promises are called the **Abrahamic Covenant**. It was an **unconditional covenant**, which means God made these promises because He is faithful, not because Abraham earned them. In Genesis 15, God showed that He alone would make sure the covenant would come true. Abraham believed in God, and he trusted that God would keep His word. God's chosen people, the Israelites, came from Abraham's family line. And through that same family line, Jesus was born! Today, everyone who trusts in Jesus becomes part of God's family and shares in His blessings. Just like Abraham, we can trust God to keep His promises. He is always faithful. What a faithful Covenant Keeper we serve!

Deuteronomy 7:9

⁹ Know therefore that the Lord your God is God; he is the faithful God, keeping his covenant of love to a thousand generations of those who love him and keep his commandments.
