THE PLAN

So, what's the plan? We're glad you asked. The next number of months are designed to walk us through a divine adventure. Our sermons, Impact Group sessions, and Reading Plans will all dovetail. It will be total immersion in one direction: God being glorified in the end!

This booklet will be **your road map.** Each day of each week is completely defined within this booklet. This booklet and your Bible are all you will need!

So, here is what we are asking you to do...

Attend the Sunday Service each week.

Attend Impact Group regularly.

Read the Bible each day from the Reading Plan.

·· Allow God to stir your heart.

THE PRAYER

No endeavor should be undertaken without bathing the decisions and steps in prayer. Our request is that for each Sunday Service, for each time in the Reading Plan, and for each Impact Group session, you will have these goals...

 Make the name of Jesus Christ famous.
 Grasp the greatness of my God.
 Be unified as a body (Eph. 4:1-6).
 Have an abundance of joy in my awesome God (2 Cor. 8:2).
 Glorify God as I am shaped by Him (1 Cor. 10:31).
 See what in me needs to be transformed (Ps. 139:23-24).
 Repentantly hand over all of me to Him (2 Cor. 3:16-18).

THE INTERPRETING APPROACH

Have you **ever noticed** how there are **so many different interpretations** of the Book of Revelation? Why is that? In short, **each interpretation** is actually formed by an **approach to reading and interpreting.**

FORMAT AND UNDERSTANDING

The Book of Revelation is a single book with three different genres, or types of writing.

- Epistolary: a letter from John to the seven churches near him
- Prophetic: a collection of events that will take place before the Second Coming of Jesus
- Apocalyptic: visions recorded in sets of symbols and meanings that ultimately display the Hand of God in full control of this world

When looking at **prophetic and apocalyptic** literature, there are really **three major choices** for understanding the timeline (when the event takes place):

- Past: has already been fulfilled
- Present: fulfilled in the current and ongoing time frame
- Future: yet to be fulfilled, but will be

OUR APPROACH

Because of these multiple styles, it is important for us to **establish how we** will read and interpret. So, this will be our basic approach...

- Plain Sense Read: "If the plain sense makes sense, don't look for any other sense."
- Prophetic Read: If a match for that event has already happened, maybe
 it is already fulfilled. If it is similar, but not exact, it is still future.
- Apocalyptic Read:

Where an image is defined, then that is its symbolic meaning. Where an image is undefined, we must decide:

.... Is it literal or symbolic?

.... If it's symbolic, what is its significance?

CAUTION: Spiritualizing everything will land a sense of truth, but may walk past literal detail that God intended for us to understand.


