
The TRUTH about why the Bible is so important - 1 Thessalonians 2:13-16 & Psalm 19:7-9


The TRUTH about who created me - Psalm 139:13-18


The TRUTH about when I hurt - Psalm 34:17-22


The TRUTH about God's plan to save me - Isaiah 9:1-7


The TRUTH about why bad things happen - Romans 3:10-12, Genesis 3:13-19, & Revelation 21:1-4

EXPEDITION OVERVIEW

In Genesis 3:13–19, Adam and Eve were created with the ability to choose between right and wrong. The serpent tempted them to sin by leading them to doubt the goodness of God. Adam and Eve disobeyed God by eating from the tree He had commanded them not to. This sinful choice brought devastating consequences—not only for them, but for all of humanity. 
The TRUTH about the ONE way to God - John 14:1-7


The TRUTH about how God knows me - Psalm 139:1-10


The TRUTH about friendship - 1 Samuel 18:1-4 & 1 Samuel 20


The TRUTH about Ioneliness - Psalm 25:8-22

The TRUTH about saying you're sorry - Psalm 32


EXPEDITION OVERVIEW

David wrote Psalm 32 after asking God to forgive some awful sinful decisions he had made. He knew he had not kept the commandments God had given him. Before he confessed his sins, he tried to hide them from God. None of those things worked for David; they won't work for us either. By trying to hide his sin, he only made things worse for himself, as we see in verses 3 and 4. Only God can truly cover and remove our sin and guilt. When David asked God for forgiveness, God showed mercy and forgave him.

David encourages everyone to turn to God for forgiveness. After experiencing God's forgiveness, he no longer felt the need to hide from Him. 
The TRUTH about prayer - 2 Chronicles 7:11-22

The TRUTH about helping those in need - Luke 10:25-37


EXPEDITION OVERVIEW
