





The TRUTH about faith - Galatians 2:11-21

EXPEDITION OVERVIEW

In Galatians 2:11-21, the apostle Peter had been pulling back from spending time with Gentile believers. Earlier in Acts 10, God had told Peter he was free to eat of other foods and to be unified with the Gentile believers. At some point, other Jewish people arrived who questioned Peter's actions in doing this. As a result, Peter lived in fear and not by faith in God, so he separated himself from the Gentiles. Paul witnessed this and confronted him on his lack of faith in following the truth of the Gospel. Peter was acting like it was works of the law that saved people. Instead, Paul shared the truth that we are saved through faith in Jesus and not by what rules we follow. Paul went on to share how he refused to follow the rules of the law anymore. Instead, he was united to Jesus Christ in His death and resurrection through faith and not by works. In verses 20-21, Paul now lives his life in faith in Jesus, who loved him enough to die for him.

The TRUTH about worrying - Matthew 6:25-34

EXPEDITION OVERVIEW

In Matthew 6:25-34, we continue reading about the Sermon on the Mount given by Jesus, starting in chapter 5. At the beginning of chapter 6, Jesus warned us about the importance of living for God and not for the things of this world. If our focus is on gaining material things in this life, we are missing it completely. We are focusing on the here and now instead of thinking of God with an eternal focus. Starting in verse 25, Jesus went on to say that if we are focused on gaining the things of this world, the result will be living with worry. The birds and the flowers aren't worried about what is happening because God is their Creator who cares for His creation. We are so much more important to God than the birds and flowers. We can focus on God and seek to bring Him glory. God will provide for us as we live our lives focused on Him and not on things of this earth. We can trust that God loves us and will take care of us.

The TRUTH about walking in God's Light - 1 John 1:5-10

EXPEDITION OVERVIEW

John begins by telling us this message is one he heard from Jesus. God is light, and there is no darkness in Him at all. God's light reveals our sins' darkness. If we have put our trust in Jesus to save us, we now live in a right relationship with God. We cannot continue to live in sinful darkness if we love and follow God. When we sin against God, we can bring it to light and ask for forgiveness instead of continuing to live in sinful darkness. John talks about some people who claim to love Jesus yet continue to live a life full of sin. We can seek to love the Lord and ask for forgiveness when we sin against Him. These verses encourage us to live a life in a relationship with God and not to live a life of hiding our sin by staying in darkness. Praise God for His faithfulness to forgive us and make us more like Him as we walk in His light.

EXPEDITION OVERVIEW

In 2 Corinthians 12:1-10, many false teachers were trying to prove they were superior to Paul in the messages they received from God. In verses 1-5, Paul was most likely talking about his own experiences with revelations from God. He was so humble that he referred to himself in the third person in these verses. Throughout the book of Acts, God encouraged Paul through visions, as seen in Acts 16:9, 18:9, 27:23, and 23:11. Paul was tempted by pride because of these revelations, so God permitted Paul to have some troubles so he would remain humble and dependent on God. In Paul's weakness, God's perfect power was on full display. We, too, can depend on God no matter what we are walking through.

The TRUTH about obeying God, not the world - Daniel 3

EXPEDITION OVERVIEW

In Daniel 3, King Nebuchadnezzar created a golden image that everyone was commanded to bow down to and worship when they heard music playing. If people refused to bow down and worship the golden image, they would be thrown into a fiery furnace. Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego refused to bow down to the golden image in obedience to God. They had faith in God, knowing He was in control no matter what. These young men told the king that God could deliver them, but even if that wasn’t His plan, they would still obey God no matter what. They refused to sin against God by doing what the world asked them to do. The king was angry and ordered them to be thrown into the furnace. Nebuchadnezzar thought they would die in the furnace; however, when he looked in the furnace, four people were there instead of three. Jesus Christ was with Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego in the furnace. He had delivered them! These three young men were witnesses to all of Babylon of who the One true God was. Even the king recognized God as the only true God.

The TRUTH about not following my heart - Jeremiah 17:1-10

EXPEDITION OVERVIEW

In Jeremiah 17, King Josiah had died, and the people of Judah once again turned away from the Lord. They sinned against the Lord through their worship of false gods. The sin was so severe that even the children of Judah were taught to worship false idols. The prophet Jeremiah showed the difference between people who look to men for safety instead of those who look to God. When we put our trust in man and not God, it reveals our hearts have turned against the Lord. This passage shows us that when we choose to sin against God, the sin comes from our own hearts. Our hearts are sinful, so if we choose to follow our hearts, we are getting ourselves into a big, sinful mess. Even though the world tells us to follow our hearts, it is important to follow what God's Word says. We can go to God's Word and ask Him to help us follow Him and not our hearts.

EXPEDITION OVERVIEW

In 1 Corinthians 12:4-30, Paul was writing to the church in Corinth. In the Bible, Paul refers to the church as “the body of Christ.” Just as a body has many parts to it, so does the church. The church has many members who together make up the body. When we put our trust in the Lord to save us, we are all given the gift of the Holy Spirit. So, as believers, this makes us all members of the body of Jesus Christ.

Just as each part of our body has a different function, each member of the church has different gifts. God has a plan and gifts for each one of us. We can all work together to bring glory to God and bring unity within the church. Paul went on to explain some of the gifts people may have. The apostles and prophets shared with us the ministry of Jesus. Next, teachers helped to set up the church while the other members helped to grow the church. Whatever gifts God has given us, we can seek to love and give glory to God through the gifts He gives us.

EXPEDITION OVERVIEW

Revelation completes the story that was started in the book of Genesis. The word “revelation” means “unveiling.” This book pulls back the veil by letting us see Jesus Christ glorified in Heaven. As we learned earlier, the Gospels teach us about the first coming of Jesus, when He was born in Bethlehem. Revelation focuses on the second coming of Christ and the fulfillment of the plans and promises God has made. In Revelation 21, we see a picture of the New Jerusalem, which is a part of the New Heaven and New Earth. Here, Jesus will be living among all believers, who have put their trust in Him. He will make all things new. There will be no sickness, sadness, death, or things that are now found on Earth. In fact, there will be no moon or sun because the light of God’s glory will provide the light. What a beautiful and glorious future we can look forward to, spending all eternity in Heaven with God!

The TRUTH about God being with me - Joshua 1

EXPEDITION OVERVIEW

In Joshua 1, we read about the fulfillment of the promise God gave to Abraham regarding the Promised Land of Canaan. Before this passage, Moses had died, and God had chosen Joshua to be the new leader to take over leading the Israelites. God told Joshua to enter the Promised Land, to defeat the enemies there, and to take over the land of Canaan that was promised to the Israelites. God never asked Joshua to do this on his own strength. Instead, God said He would be with him wherever he went.

God didn't give Joshua all the details on how these three things would happen. Instead, Joshua was encouraged to trust in the promises of God and to know that God would be with him. It was Joshua's job to lead by example by stepping out in faith and entering the Promised Land God had given them. We, too, can trust the promises God gives us in His Word. We can know God will be with us just as He was with Joshua.

Even though the tongue is small, it can cause a great amount of damage. James describes the tongue like a fire out of control or a beast that cannot be tamed. In Matthew 12, we know the mouth speaks what is in the heart. As humans, we have no ability to control our tongues. God's Spirit within us can help change us to make us more like Him. God, through us, helps to control our tongue and our hearts so that our lives show we love the Lord.

We can ask Jesus to be in control of our hearts so we can live in peace with each other. So that whatever we do, we are doing it to give glory to God and not to ourselves.

EXPEDITION OVERVIEW

In John 16:16-33, Jesus spoke these words to His disciples before He would be arrested and crucified. He told them His disciples would not see Him anymore because He would go to God the Father. This confused the disciples, so Jesus explained that after His death, the world would rejoice while the followers of Jesus would grieve. This grief would last only a short while, and eventually it would turn to joy. They would realize Jesus would have to die and rise again in order for us to have forgiveness of sins. When Jesus would rise from the dead, the disciples' weeping would turn into massive joy! Jesus went on to explain that after He would ascend back into Heaven, the Holy Spirit would come to help them. The disciples would continue on with the work Jesus had started. They would share the Gospel of Jesus with the world. God's Spirit would guide them as they went, telling others about Him. In the last part of these verses, Jesus warned the disciples that they would face many problems. Even though things in this world will be tough, Jesus told them to be encouraged because Jesus has overcome the world. This truth stands for us today as well. In this world, we will face many problems and hardships. We, too, can have peace knowing Jesus has won!

EXPEDITION OVERVIEW

In Revelation 19:11-16, John tells us about the Second Coming of Jesus. John sees Jesus on a white horse, who is coming in victory. In Bible times, it was common for generals or kings to ride on their horses throughout the area to showcase the victory that had happened. Here, Jesus will reveal His victory over sin and wickedness in the world. The names “King of Kings” and “Lord of Lords” reveal the victory of Jesus Christ. Jesus is coming back the second time with His full glory on display, which is very different from when He came the first time as a baby. Jesus will come along with His holy ones, which most likely refers to those who are saved and angels, as seen in 1 Thessalonians 3:13. Jesus Himself will defeat His enemies. He will rule over all the people of the earth, including all the rulers and kings. He will put an end to sin and make things right. Jesus is King over all the heavens and the earth. What marvelous hope we have in Jesus! We can’t wait for Jesus to come back to make things right.
