TAKING A CLOSER LOOK

The Northern Kingdom, Israel, endured evil kings for 130 years, but during all that time, God sent prophets to warn and guide them, always delivering God's messages to them. They also demonstrated God's power through miracles during their years of ministry.

3 ROLES & THE IMPORTANCE OF EACH

Kings Supreme rulers over a country, region, or people. In fulfillment of God's covenant, any king over God's people must be from the lineage of David.

Priests Represent the people to God; must be from the tribe of Levi and observe all the requirements in the Law of Moses.

Prophets Called by God to represent God to people, whomever and wherever God directs; can be from any tribe or country.
