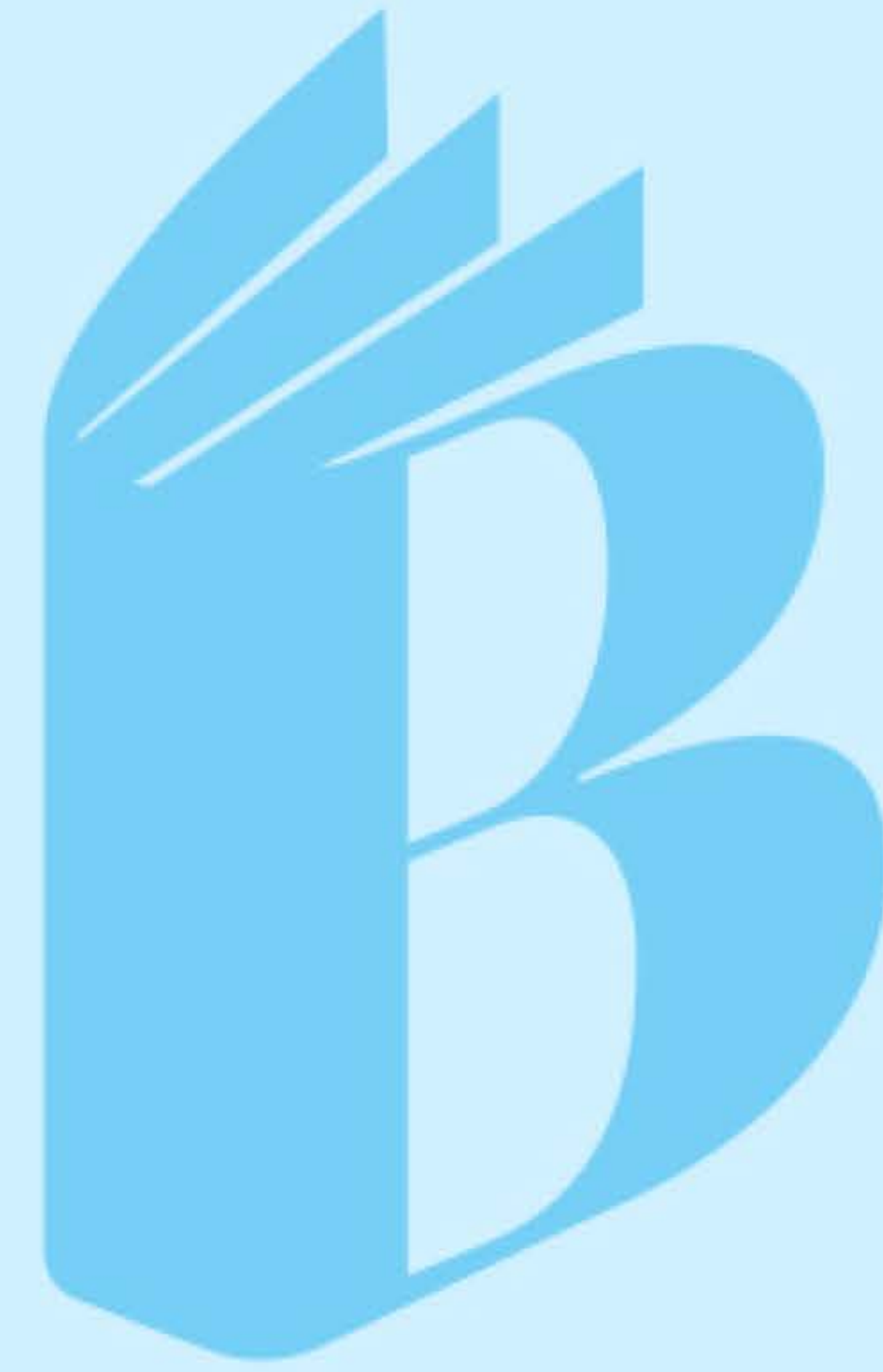

OBSERVATION

What does the text say?

INTERPRETATION

What does it mean?

APPLICATION

What did I learn that should affect my life?

OBSERVATION

- **Mark key words and phrases** (person, theme)
- **Look for lists**
- **Watch for contrasts and comparisons** (like, as)
- **Note expressions of time** (until, then, when, after, a date, day of week, etc.)
- **Identify terms of conclusion** (wherefore, therefore, because, finally)

INTERPRETATION

- **The Rule of Context**
- **Other Scripture References**
- **Take the Scripture At Face Value**
(In its natural, normal sense)

*Understand and recognize figures of speech
and interpret them accordingly.*

APPLICATION

- **What did I learn that should affect my life?**
- **Does this expose any error in my beliefs or behavior?**
- **Are there any truths, commands or promises that apply to me?**

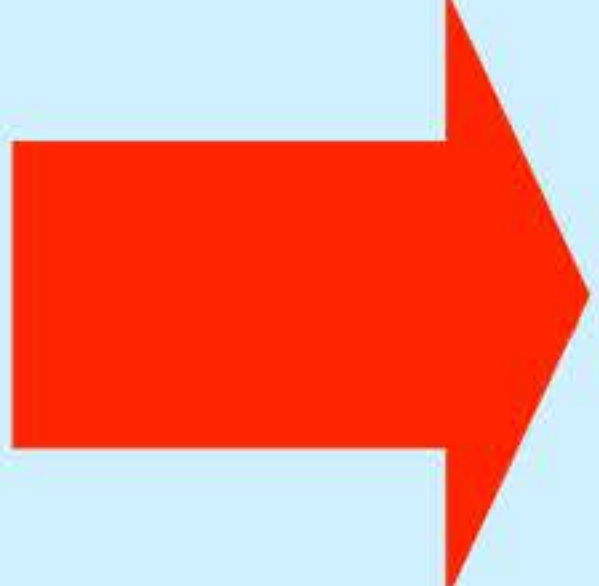

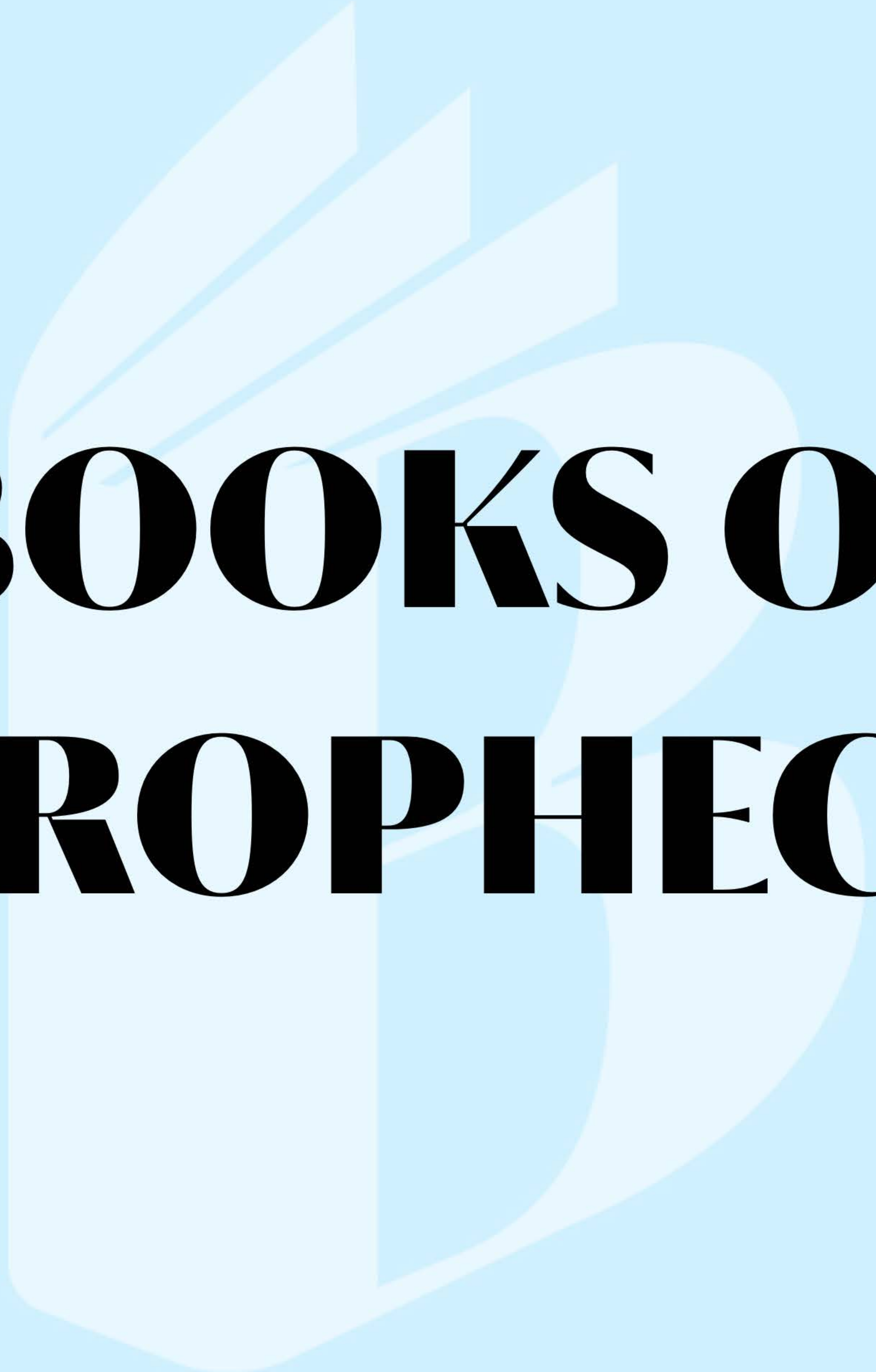

ABOUT PROPHECY

Greek word *propheteia* from two words:

pro - forth

phemi - to speak

To speak forth the mind and counsel of God.
Revealing God's will and purposes

INCLUDES

- Forth-telling: the prophet's own time or near fulfillment
- Fore-telling: a future fulfillment

WHY PROPHECY?

1) A call to godly living

“Come now, let’s settle this,” says the Lord. “Though your sins are like scarlet, I will make them as white as snow. Though they are red like crimson, I will make them as white as wool.”

Isaiah 1:18

WHY PROPHECY?

2) To build faith and confidence in the God who miraculously foretold events.

I tell you this beforehand, so that when it happens you will believe that I am the Messiah. John 13:19

I have told you these things before they happen so that when they do happen, you will believe. John 14:29

KEEP IN MIND

The prophets did not always indicate intervals of time between events nor did they always write in chronological order.

Always consider the historical context of that writing, remembering that God was delivering His prophecy to a particular people at a particular time.

KEEP IN MIND

The meaning of a specific prophecy could not always be understood by the prophet or by the people who heard the message.

I heard what he said, but I did not understand what he meant. So I asked, “How will all this finally end, my lord?” But he said, “Go now, Daniel, for what I have said is kept secret and sealed until the time of the end.

Daniel 12:8-9

ISAIAH, THE MAN

- His name means “Jehovah Saves.”
- His father is Amoz. (not to be confused with Amos, the prophet)
- He was married
- He had two sons

ACCORDING TO JEWISH TRADITION

- He was a man of wealth, rank and learning
- He was executed by Manasseh (see Hebrews 11:37)

ISAIAH'S CALLING

Then I heard the Lord asking, “Whom should I send as a messenger to this people? Who will go for us?”

I said, “Here I am. Send me.”

Isaiah 6:8



THE KINGS

UZZIAH (AZARIAH)

Made king at age of sixteen

Reigned 52 years

Brought the nation to its greatest days since David and Solomon

But...

But when he had become powerful, he also became proud, which led to his downfall. He sinned against the Lord his God by entering the sanctuary of the Lord's Temple and personally burning incense on the incense altar.

2 Chronicles 26:16

JOTHAM

Was co-regent after his father was struck with

Reigned 16 years

Was a good and powerful king

*King Jotham became powerful because he was
careful to live in obedience to the Lord his God.
2 Chronicles 27:6*

AHAZ

Reigned 16 years

Encouraged his people to sin

Was utterly unfaithful to the Lord

He shut the doors of the Lord's Temple so that no one could worship there, and he set up altars to pagan gods in every corner of Jerusalem. 2 Chronicles 28:24

HEZEKIAH

Reigned 42 years

One of Judah's greatest kings

Led the people back to the Lord

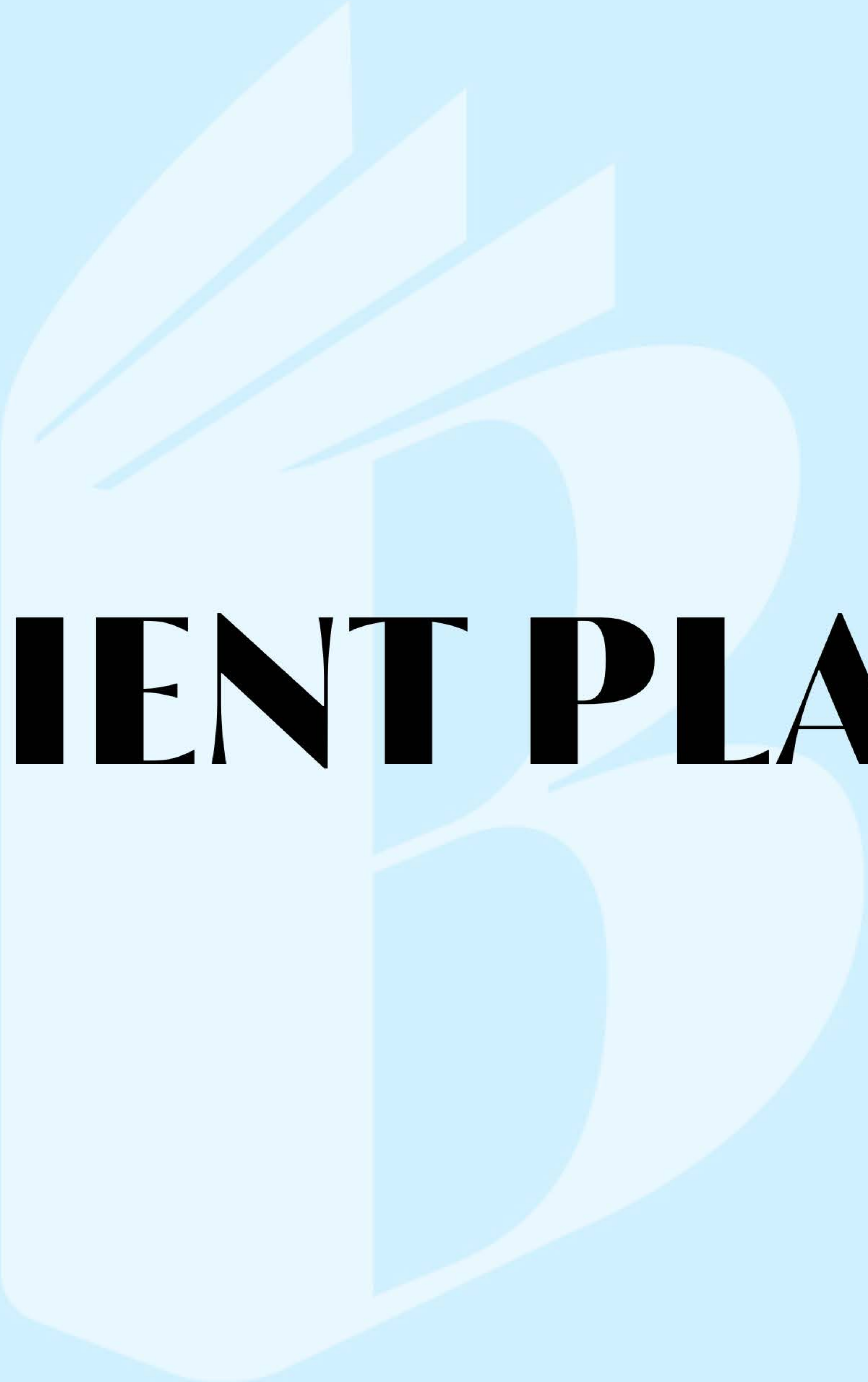
Built the famous water system that still exists in Jerusalem

ISAIAH'S OWN

NORTHERN KINGDOM

What sorrow awaits the proud city of Samaria—
the glorious crown of the drunks of Israel.

It sits at the head of a fertile valley,
but its glorious beauty will fade like a flower.
It is the pride of a people
brought down by wine.

²For the Lord will send a mighty army against it.

Like a mighty hailstorm and a torrential rain,
they will burst upon it like a surging flood
and smash it to the ground.

HEZEKIAH

About that time Hezekiah became deathly ill, and the prophet Isaiah son of Amoz went to visit him. He gave the king this message: “This is what the Lord says: ‘Set your affairs in order, for you are going to die. You will not recover from this illness.’”

² When Hezekiah heard this, he turned his face to the wall and prayed to the Lord, ³ “Remember, O Lord, how I have always been faithful to you and have served you single-mindedly, always doing what pleases you.” Then he broke down and wept bitterly.

⁴ Then this message came to Isaiah from the Lord: ⁵ “Go back to Hezekiah and tell him, ‘This is what the Lord, the God of your ancestor David, says: I have heard your prayer and seen your tears. I will add fifteen years to your life, ⁶ and I will rescue you and this city from the king of Assyria. Yes, I will defend this city.

⁷ ““And this is the sign from the Lord to prove that he will do as he promised: ⁸ I will cause the sun’s shadow to move ten steps backward on the sundial of Ahaz!”” So the shadow on the sundial moved backward ten steps.
