

Paul wrote his letter to the church at Philippi while imprisoned, and the context is about finding personal contentment in Christ independent of outward circumstance which, by the way, were not positive for the apostle Paul at that particular time.

So, this viral verse is not dealing with the ability to succeed, gain accomplishment, break through a barrier, finish a race, or win a game. It's about finding strength in Christ to be content in the midst of difficult circumstances and times of persecution! And rather than expecting God to change his situation, Paul used this truth to find strength to endure that situation and to be content despite of that situation.

That is what Philippians 4:13 is all about! And if that is what is kept in mind, then, yes, it needs to go viral!

# FIVE UNIQUE PRINCIPLES SET FORTH IN OUR DECLARATION OF



They were all found guilty of treason, some were hunted, lost homes and property, fled with their families to avoid capture, and had family members killed. Yet despite the high cost, get this, **no signer ever went back on his personal pledge**, and America eventually won its freedom!

The stories of the signers inspire us, and America thrived under the five unique principles they set forth in the Declaration:

- There is a Creator, and this Creator provides the moral authority for our founding documents.
- The Creator has given a certain set of unalienable rights to every individual.
- The primary purpose of government is to protect those unalienable rights.
- There is a fixed moral law, "the laws of Nature and of Nature's God."
- Decisions below the level of unalienable rights and fixed morals are to be made with the consent of the governed.




