<p><b>Discuss</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Does your family have any Easter traditions? If so, what are they?</li><li>Do they point to Jesus' resurrection in any way? If so, how?</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>When the Jewish people (likely the leaders) asked Jesus for a sign to validate His authority to do the things He was doing, He said that He would, "destroy this Temple, and in three days I will raise it up."</li><li>He gave a similar response in Matthew 16:4.</li><li>Why do you think the resurrection was the only sign He would give this particular group of people? After all, He performed miracles for others.</li></ul>

<p><b>Read</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>John 2:13-22</li></ul> <p><b>Reflect</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Why was Jesus so upset about what was happening at the Temple?</li><li>Did His actions surprise you?</li></ul>	<p><b>Reflect</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>If Jesus is the "Temple" that will never be destroyed again, but will instead reign over sin and death forever, in what way to I fail to live as though this is true in my own life? (i.e. worry; fear, etc.)</li><li>If the author of Hebrews tells us that Jesus is the final sacrifice for sin, and that I am completely forgiven by Him, in what way to I fail to live the way God wants me to in response to this? (i.e. legalism? license?)</li><li>Who is God asking me to share the Good News of the resurrection with this week?</li></ul>
