(Remember, many people say “loving God <i>completely</i>” is hardest without being honest about how hard it is to “love self <i>correctly</i>”, or “love others <i>compassionately</i>”.)

<p>Read</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Luke 10:25-37 <p>Discuss</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What did it cost the Good Samaritan to show the wounded man mercy? What about grace? As Jesus was teaching His disciples what it means to “look” like Him, why does He tell them this parable? What point is He trying to make? 	<p>Questions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What has following Jesus cost you in your own life? Is there something He is asking you to do right now that may cost you something? What is it? Pastors Dave, Colin, and Tyler shared what following Jesus is going to cost our church this year. Why do you think this is so important for our pastors to model: to our kids/students, to our larger church, and to our community? <p>Prayer</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Take prayer requests and pray for each other.
