(1) Getting Started	(3) Digging Deeper
Prayer Requests - Take prayer requests and spend time as a group in prayer, either at the beginning or end of the meeting. Getting to Know You - Who is someone from a different generation who you look up to or has brought you closer to Jesus? - What do you admire about them? Read Mark 10:13-16 - What was Jesus’ “beef” with the disciples in this passage? - Why do you think the disciples rebuked the children who wanted to touch Jesus? - How did Jesus show value and love for children in this passage? - What does this reveal about the disciples’ hearts? What does it reveal about Jesus’ heart? - According to Jesus, how should someone welcome the kingdom of God? What does that mean for all generations?
(2) Read Scripture	(4) Application
Read - Deuteronomy 6:1-9 Questions - What was the purpose of God giving this commandment to Israel before entering the Promised Land? - What roles do kids, parents, and grandparents have in this passage? Where do you see the significance of other generations related to this commandment? - In what ways would Israel prosper if they were to obey? (see v. 10-25)	Questions - Take time to share what you value about different generations than your own. - What are some ways you can grow closer to people in your life who are older or younger? - How could we, as a Small Group, invite other generations to the “table”? - What are ways our church can invite all generations to the same table?
