TELL THE STORY 1 Chronicles 16:23-24

CONNECT

1. Share a time when you told someone about Jesus.

GOING DEEPER

- 2. Read Deuteronomy 26:5–11. Which points in the passage portray the rhythm of rescue, reward and response?
- 3. This rhythm is found also in 1 Chronicles 16:8–24. Reading through those verses, which ones best capture rescue, reward and response?
- 4. First Chronicles 16:23 gives a vision for "all the earth." What is it and why is it important? See Psalm 66:4, 1 Chronicles 29:11 and Revelation 4:11 for further insight.
- 5. In 1 Chronicles 16:23–24 we see the exhortations to "tell" and "declare" about God—His salvation and glory and work—among all nations. Why do "all the peoples" matter so much to God?

ACTION

6. Consider the following chart. What is your number today? Ask Jesus to help you move even one degree up the scale. Each day ask Him to help you be ready, care genuinely and speak Jesus.



7. Deuteronomy 26:5–11 is an ancient credal statement (a story of how God rescues and rewards and how we respond). How might you use your own credal statement to share the gospel with another person?
