Questions God Asks

Why do you cry to me?

Exodus 14:15

CONNECT

1. Share about a time when you were meaningfully stuck between a proverbial rock and a hard place.

GOING DEEPER

2. According to Exodus 14:10–14, Moses exhibited great confidence in God's power and care when facing the threat of Egypt's approaching army. What were the reasons he could be so confident?
3. Exodus 14:15 suggests that, despite his confidence, Moses seemed stuck or unsure about what should happen next. Speculate on why Moses might be uncertain.
4. The last sentence in Exodus 14:15, plus what we read in verse 16, finds God challenging Moses to act with decision. As followers of Jesus, what helps us to act with decision?
5. Read 2 Peter 1:3–4. What is learned from this passage that enables us to step out in active, decisive faith?

ACTION

6. Imagine at this moment the Lord asking you, "Why do you cry out to me?" How do you answer this question? Why? What action steps must you take today?
7. How might you use God's question and directives in Exodus 14:15–16 to invite someone to follow Jesus?
