

CONNECT

1. Even as Christians it is too easy to put God second place in our lives. Why?

GOING DEEPER

2.	God's people have returned to their homeland and need to rebuild God's temple, yet they keep delaying,
	saying, "the time has not yet come to rebuild the house of the LORD" (Haggai 1:2). What are some reasons we
	put off tending to the Lord's agenda?

3.	Read Haggai 1:2. The Lord commonly refers to the Jews as "His people," but here He seems to	distance Himself
	from them by calling them "these people." Why?	

- 4. Haggai 1:4 finds God asking a probing question. What is the question and how might you relate to it today?
- 5. What is at stake before a watching world if the Lord's temple in Jerusalem is left in disarray? What messages does it send?
- 6. Consider Haggai 1:5–11. What is the story these verses tell?

- 7. Read again Haggai 1:4. Imagine the Lord asking you this. What is your reaction?
- 8. How might you use God's question in Haggai 1:4 to share the gospel of Jesus with another?
