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Questions God Asks

With What Can We Compare the Kingdom of God?

Mark 4:30–32

CONNECT

1. What comes to mind when you think “kingdom of God”?

GOING DEEPER

2. How would you describe the kingdom of God? See Romans 14:17–19.
3. Read Mark 4:30–32. What is the significance of the small seed growing into the larger bush?
4. What might the birds (Mark 4:32) imply? See Matthew 11:29.
5. How do Jesus’ words in Mark 4:30–32 contrast with King Nebuchadnezzar’s dream in Daniel 4:10–14? Why does this matter?
6. See Philippians 3:20. What are the differences between citizenship in God’s kingdom and citizenship in your own nation? Which is more important and why? See Acts 1:6–8.

7. What are practical ways you will advance God’s kingdom today?
8. How will sensitivity to God’s kingdom purposes change your prayer life?
