Date Night—Disc Golf



THE SAGA OF ELIJAH 1 Kings 18:17–19:21

CONNECT

1. If your emotions were animal, what animal would they be and why?
2. How does the way you think God views you affect the way you engage with others around you?

GOING DEEPER

3. Skim 1 Kings 18 & 19. What parts of Elijah's saga stand out to you?
4. Read 1 Kings 18:16–38. Compare how the prophets of Baal related to their god to how Elijah related to his?
5. Read 1 Kings 19:3–15. How did God meet Elijah in his lows? How has God met you there as well? See Luke 12 for more insight.
6. Elijah felt alone, but was he really? Take a look at the story and note the community of faithful people at play in Elijah's story.

ACTION

7. How can you be intentional this week to reflect on how you think God views you? If some of those views don't line up with truth, how can you bring those to Him?
