Discussion Guide July 9, 2023

REININKING THE DREAM LUKE 12:13-34
CONNECT 1. What is one thing that makes you anxious in our world today?
2. Do you find Luke 12:13–34 convicting, comforting or both? Why do you think that is?
GOING DEEPER 3. Skim Luke 12:13–34. Are there any parts of the passage that stand out to you?
4. Read Luke 12:15, 21. Why do you think that Jesus is so concerned with covetousness, greed and the pursuit of money?
5. Read Luke 12:22–30. What comfort for our anxieties do these verses provide? Is it difficult believe and really internalize these promises?
6. Read Luke 12:31–34. In light of God's promises to provide for us from the previous verses, what is He calling us to at the end of this passage?
ACTION7. How can you be intentional this week to reflect on how you think God views you? If some of those views don't line up with truth, how can you bring those to Him?
