WAIT ON THE LORD 1 Corintians 11:17–34

CONNECT

1. Share about a situation in which waiting on the Lord has been really challenging.

GOING DEEPER

2.	Read Isaiah 41:31,	Psalm 27:14,	Psalm 37:7	and Psalm	130:5-6.	What do you	learn from	these pas	sages abo	ut
	waiting on the Lord	: ?b								

3.	Read Psalm 37:34. In the Hebrew language, the word for waiting implies twisting and stretching and endurance
	like a rope pulled taut and vibrating under pressure. Talk about how this imagery rightly reflects waiting on
	something or someone.

4. Read 1 Corinthians 11:26 regarding the Lord's Supper. It speaks to remembering the body and blood of Jesus ("eat this bread and drink this cup"), yet also anticipates waiting "until [Jesus] comes" back in glory. How does remembering well help us wait well?

ACTION

- 5. What are you waiting on now and how can your brothers and sisters in Christ wait with you?
- 6. How might waiting on the Lord shape your articulation of the gospel? With whom will you share this story?
