

NEW HOPE FOR THE NATIONS Matthew 12:21

1. Read Matthew 12:21. How does new hope for the nations translate into how we relate to the nations that are represented within the Twin Cities? What specific effort have you made to connect with those around you who come from among the nations? How many friends do you have from other nations?

2. To foster a heart for the nations and share the new hope Jesus brings, what fears or presuppositions do we need to set aside? Be very specific. Take time to prayerfully lay these things before Jesus.

3. Consider Isaiah 42:2–3. How do these two verses inform how we should welcome those around us and those from among the nations?

4. Read Galatians 5:25. What space must we leave in our lives to allow the Holy Spirit to lead us toward the nations?
