

Sermon Discussion Questions

September 7, 2025 Exodus 15:1-21 Sing to the Redeemer

- 1. The sermon describes how God's small breath (blast of His nostrils) parted the Red Sea. What does this poetic imagery teach us about God's power? Where have you seen God's power work in seemingly small ways in your own life?
- 2. Pastor Clint lists several reasons why we sing, including that God commands it and that God wins. Which of these reasons resonates most with you and why? How might understanding these reasons change your approach to worship through singing?
- 3. The sermon explains that God gets glory by saving people through judgment, as seen in the Red Sea crossing and ultimately at the cross. How does this help us understand both God's justice and His mercy? How does understanding both God's justice and mercy impact your view of your own salvation?
- 4. Why is singing such a vital expression of worship in the lives of God's people, both in biblical times and today? In what ways can you incorporate singing or expressions of worship into your daily life as a response to your own experiences of God's grace and salvation?
- 5. In Exodus 15:2, Moses uses personal pronouns like 'my strength' and 'my salvation.' Why is it significant that our faith must be personal rather than just believing in general truths? How has your relationship with God moved from general beliefs to personal faith and trust?
