Anchor Within the Veil

God's Amazing Grace

The tabernacle was surprisingly small (about 700 square feet)—smaller than most homes. What does God's willingness to dwell in such a humble structure teach us about His character and how He meets us?

How does the portable nature of the tabernacle encourage you when you think about God's presence in different seasons or locations of your life?

God's Sovereign Plans

Pastor Clint said, "God is using everything in your life—the good things and the bad things—to bring you closer to Him." How have you seen this truth play out in your own story, even when you couldn't understand it at the time?

When facing circumstances that seem senseless or painful, how can we hold onto the truth that "God's sovereign plans are always good" without minimizing real suffering?

Fellowship with God

The sermon emphasized that "you were made to fellowship with God." In practical terms, what does daily fellowship with God look like in your life right now? What helps or hinders it?

The Holy of Holies was described as a "cool, dark place" reminiscent of Eden's fellowship. What does it mean to you that God desires intimate fellowship with you, not just religious duty?

Growing Closer to God

"God seems better the closer you get to Him." Have you experienced this? Share a time when deeper knowledge of God or His Word increased your awe and gratitude.

The tabernacle had bronze in the outer court, silver in the Holy Place, and gold in the Holy of Holies. How does this progression picture spiritual growth and maturity in our walk with Christ?

Protection and the Gospel

The cherubim on the veil reminded Israel of both paradise lost and God's protective holiness. Why is it significant that the veil was torn from *top to bottom* when Jesus died (Mark 15:38)?

Hebrews 6:19-20 says our hope "enters into the inner place behind the curtain, where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf." How does Jesus as our "forerunner" change how you approach God?

Application

How can the truths from this passage help us minister to others (or ourselves) in the midst of unexplainable suffering?

What is one specific way you can cultivate deeper fellowship with God this week? What might need to change in your schedule, priorities, or heart posture?

Closing

"On Christ the solid rock I stand; all other ground is sinking sand." What "sinking sand" are you tempted to build your hope on instead of Christ? How can this group pray for you?
