Micah 5:1-5

Don't Give Up Hope

1. Pastor Clint emphasizes that 'God has not forgotten you, and his love is undiminished.' Why is this message particularly important during the Christmas season? When have you felt forgotten by God, and how does the Christmas story challenge that feeling?
2. The sermon discusses Bethlehem as an unlikely place for the Messiah to be born. How does God's choice of Bethlehem demonstrate His character and way of working? Where in your life have you seen God work through seemingly insignificant circumstances or weakness?
3. According to Micah 5:2-3, how does the prophecy about Jesus coming 'from ancient days' connect with the idea that God's timing is perfect? How can understanding God's perfect timing help us during seasons of waiting or difficulty?
4. Pastor Clint emphasizes that our salvation is primarily for God's glory, not just for our benefit. How does this perspective change how we view our Christian life? In what specific areas of your life do you need to shift from a self-centered to a God-centered perspective?
5. How does the sermon's discussion of Jesus as both Savior and Lord challenge common misconceptions about what it means to be a Christian? What areas of your life might you be holding back from Christ's lordship, and why?
