## On the Move – The Greatest Commandment

-Our Greatest Priority-Deuteronomy 6:4-25

Moses started his second sermon by reviewing the Ten Commandments which outlined the stipulations of their covenant relationship with God. Next, he encouraged the second generation of Israelites, who were on the move toward the Promise Land, to "be careful to do what the LORD your God has commanded you; do not turn to the right or to the left" (5:32). Now, in Chapter 6, he gives them the ultimate motivation for being careful to live a life of obedience to God, which must be our greatest priority as well – LOVE the LORD your God!
