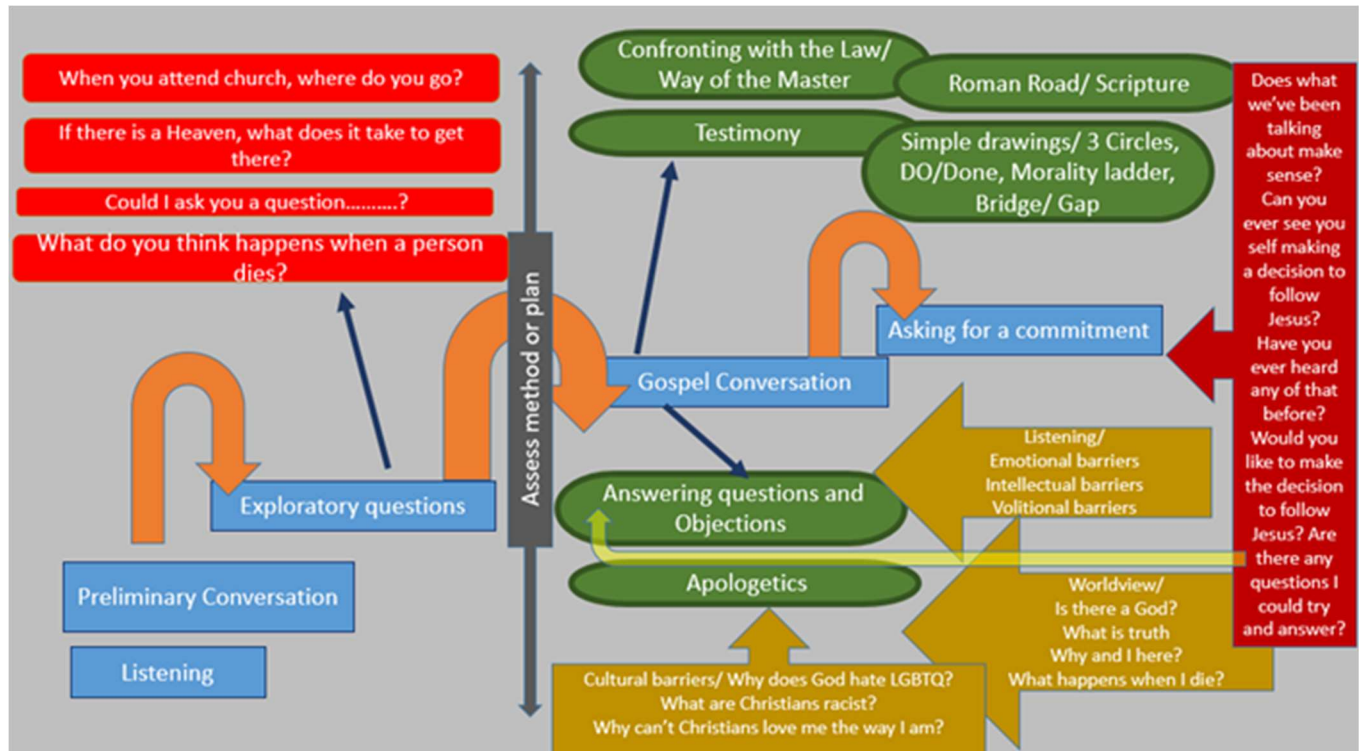


## Map of basic elements to a Gospel Conversation

1) Gospel focus/How many people heard the Gospel?	Yes, we daily wake up asking this question. 4	Sometimes, but we need to improve. 3	We go through cycles and right now not so much. 2	We're too busy trying to keep the doors open to ask this. 1	
2) Community Impact/Would the community notice if we were no longer here?	Yes, we are making a noticeable impact. 4	Yes, we have a good impact on our community as it is. 3	They would have noticed more 20 years ago. 2	It would be one more empty church building in our community. 1	
3) Purpose/Who are we?/What kind of church are we?	We are a church that engages our community. 4	We know we should be engaging our community but so far we're not. 3	We are primarily an inward focused commuter church with a few small groups in this community. 2	We are only meeting in the facility we are in until something better comes along. 1	
4) Missional Thinking/ Offense or Defense	We teach and train our people to think missionally. They view their work and place in the community as a missionary platform. 4	We hear about this from the pulpit but haven't done much to understand our community or how we make an impact. 3	Missional thinking sounds good and we are willing but not sure how to begin. 2	Our people think that the paid staff are the only ones on mission. 1	
5) Evangelism/ Teaching and Training	We have an ongoing evangelism training program for our people. 4	We've had evangelism training in the past but we don't currently but we regularly hear about it from the	We used to teach and train people in evangelism 20 years ago. 2	We do not teach or train our people in evangelism. 1	
6) Prayer	We pray for the lost and leaders in our community by name on a regular basis. 4	We have occasional prayer events where we pray for the lost and our community and we hear it from the pulpit. 3	Some of our small groups pray for the lost from time to time, we sometimes hear it from the pulpit. 2	We don't know many lost people or who the leaders in our community are. 1	
7) Measuring Effectiveness <u>internal</u> data	We've had healthy growth in Baptisms and discipleship over the last few years. 4	We're concerned about being more healthy in discipleship and evangelism. 3	We haven't baptized anyone in the last few years and theologically we don't think we can do anything about that. 2	We don't think it is biblical or spiritual to keep numbers. 1	
7) Measuring effectiveness <u>external</u> data	Things are better in our community because we are here. We see needs and issues in our community and respond with people and resources, we budget for community outreach	We're concerned about our community and have made an impact on some community issues and problems	We think about this but are not sure where to start or how to effectively meet the problems in our community. 2	We've never thought about measuring those things, and theologically we're not sure it matters. 1
